Throughout her career, Christie has also taught college courses, holding positions at Corban University, University of Portland and George Fox University in Oregon, and Regent University in Virginia. Her vast education career even includes time as a school bus driver.

Christie holds a Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Studies from Point Loma Nazarene College, a Master's in Early and Middle School Regular and Special Education from Regent University, and a Doctor of Education from George Fox. She enjoys spending time with her husband and three young adult children, listening to Switchfoot (an alt-rock band), going to the beach and volunteering for her son's theater arts group for children.
