Grant Highlights

- **9th Grade Communities:** All 9th graders belong to a small learning community. Each community includes Language Arts, NGSS Physics and 9th Grade Inquiry. In addition, 9th graders take other core courses and choose from a variety of electives.
- **Advanced Placement Courses include:** Human Geography for **all** 10th Graders, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Calculus, Environmental Science, European History, and Studio Art.
- **PSU and PCC Dual Credit Courses include:** Global City, World Civilization, Feminism and Gender Studies, African American Literature, Latin American Literature, Themes in Literature, Data and Statistics, Probability and Statistics, Journalism, Spanish, Theater and Library Internship. All juniors and seniors take dual credit English.
- Grant has an award-winning student publication called *Grant Magazine* which is now in its 10-year of operation. The magazine's staff writers can earn college journalism credits from PSU. They have won six straight Gold Crown awards from Columbia Scholastic Press Association.
- Grant's ConTeam (Constitution Team) has won Nationals three times: 2013, 2015, 2018 and has won the Oregon state competition 12 times since we started competing in the 2000-2001 school year.
- Grant is committed to providing equity in all aspects of the school community. Students have played a significant role in the addition of a number of courses related to race and culture and assist with planning school wide Race Talks four times per year.

College and Career Learning

Grant's College and Career Center works with the Counseling Department to help guide students as they prepare for the future. The Career Coordinator and parent volunteers staff the drop-in center and provide information about careers and pathways to obtain those careers. The Career Center provides information about colleges, universities, apprenticeships and/or workforce training programs. The Career Center is open daily and provides access to college representatives who visit Grant throughout the year. There are also year-round opportunities for career exploration – guest speakers, offsite career visits, job shadows and internships.

— Career Technical Education (CTE) Programs of Study —

Career Technical Education Programs offer students exposure to 21st Century career opportunities with hands-on learning in the classroom. Students learn the technical skills alongside information about careers within the field of study. Some courses offer college credit, field trips, internships, visits to work sites and other hands-on opportunities. We offer a wide variety of CTE programs of study. Our programs include:

3D Design and Applied Arts, Audio Engineering, Business Management, Computer Science, Construction, Digital Media, Engineering and Robotics, Health Science, and Multimedia/Theater Arts.

- **Competitive 6A Athletics:** Baseball, Basketball, Cheer, Cross Country, Dance Team, Football, Golf, Soccer, Softball, Swimming, Tennis, Track and Field, Volleyball and Wrestling.
- **Unified Sports:** We offer three sports through the Special Olympics of Oregon - soccer, basketball, and softball. Unified Sports is a program that combines equal numbers of Special Olympics athletes and unified partners on sports teams for training and competition.
