




What's unique about MLC?

- K-12 program: Mentorship opportunities for older students to work with younger students "Senior Buddies"
- Internships for every high school student
- CTE programs in Mass Media and Education
- Personalized education with opportunities similar to larger schools:
 8th grade Spanish for high school credit, dual-credit for high school
 Language Arts with PCC, Advanced Math, 3D Printing
- Project-based/experiential learning: Hands-on, community-based learning opportunities. Climate Justice has been a focus. Overnight opportunities starting in 4th grade.
- Storyline Approach: Focus on making learning memorable so that it has more value to the student.
- Long-standing traditions: Egg Drop, school picnics in Washington Park,
 Solstice Celebration
- Friday Focus for 7th and 8th grade: Weekly field trips that have included museum and cultural center tours, college tours, drama, yoga, and cooking.
- MLC's electives through the 8th grade engage staff, parents, community members, community organizations, and students. There is a wide variety of electives available for students to choose from.
- Full spectrum of high school classes to earn diploma. (Spanish for World Language.)
