
What's Happening Tonight

- Volunteer coalition members have collaborated to document the Phase 1 recommendation
- Tonight is the larger group's opportunity to indicate what is supported and what should be changed
- If changes are suggested we will use fist-to-five to test for consensus
- The consensus version from tonight will go to the Deputy Superintendent for recommendation to the Board of Education in January



Consensus Approach

- We will use this as a voting method for agreeing to a proposal
 - If you are a 0 or 1 you may be asked what needs to be resolved
- The final recommendation may rely on a majority rule vote



Reflecting on Our Work So Far

- Five volunteers (Andy, Beth C., Dee, Min, and Sarah) helped synthesize the conversations and feedback on Option C from last week's meeting into a draft Phase 1 recommendation.
- We focused on lifting up the rationale for the key decisions in the recommendation—something that's often gotten lost in the weeds of the many options we've discussed as a coalition.
- This recommendation has problems—as would any attempt to balance all the competing priorities here. Not everyone will agree with it (not everyone who volunteered to work on this presentation agrees with it).
- It also creates important opportunities for hundreds of students across Southeast, including many Black and Latinx students who've been waiting for a middle school for years.
- Our goal: present the recommendation, the rationale, and the positives and negatives as clearly as we can, so we
 can check our thinking as a coalition and consider any additional refinements.







What Would Change In 2021-22

- Arleta neighborhood program converts from K-8 to K-5 elementary. Grade 6-8 students transfer to Kellogg Middle School starting in the 2021-22 school year. The K-5 program feeds to Kellogg Middle School.
- Marysville neighborhood program converts from K-8 to K-5 elementary. Grade 6-8 students transfer to Kellogg Middle School starting in the 2021-22 school year. The K-5 program feeds to Kellogg Middle School.
- **Lent** neighborhood program converts from K-8 to K-5 elementary. Grade 6-8 students transfer to Kellogg Middle School starting in the 2021-22 school year. The K-5 program feeds to Kellogg Middle School.
- **Lent** Spanish dual language immersion program converts from K-8 to K-5 elementary. Grade 6-8 students transfer to Kellogg Middle School starting in the 2021-22 school year. The K-5 program feeds to Kellogg Middle School.
- **Bridger** Spanish dual language immersion program converts from K-8 to K-5 elementary. Grade 6-8 students transfer to Kellogg Middle School starting in the 2021-22 school year. The K-5 program feeds to Kellogg Middle School. (Implications for the **Bridger neighborhood 6-8 program** are discussed below.)
- Atkinson Elementary/Mt. Tabor Middle School Spanish dual language immersion program transfers to Kellogg Middle School in the 2021-22 school year.



What Would Not Change In 2021-22

- Creston remains a K-8 school in 2021-22, with its MS/HS feeder path to be confirmed in Phase 2 of the SEGC work. It will convert to a K-5 school in Fall 2022.
- **Harrison Park** remains a K-8 school in 2021-22, to be converted to a middle school in Fall 2022 as previously scheduled (with its feeder schools to be decided in Phase 2 of the guiding coalition's work).
- Atkinson neighborhood program remains assigned to Mt. Tabor MS for the 2021-22 school year. The
 guiding coalition will consider Atkinson's long-term feeder path during Phase 2 of its work.
- All K-5 DLI program locations and configurations remain unchanged for 2021-22. The SEGC will
 consider any changes to these programs in Phase 2 of its work
- All K-5 attendance boundaries remain unchanged for 2021-22. The SEGC will consider boundary changes during Phase 2 of its work.



Phase 1 Priorities Addressed by This Recommendation

- Middle school assignment for 3 of 6 K-8 schools in the cluster for Fall 2021. Lents, Marysville, and Arleta serve a
 notably high percentage of BIPOC and lower income students.
- Initial Kellogg enrollment is below the 80% utilization rate target. This leaves room to add additional schools during
 Phase 2, absorb growth that is typical with new school openings, and add special education classrooms as needed.
- Alleviates Bridger's overcrowding and allows the kindergarten to return to the school
- Consolidates outer SE 6-8 Spanish DLI programs near highest concentration of native Spanish speakers. Also creates
 the consistency in staffing and programming promotes the efficacy of program in the upper grades.
- Leaves open a full range of Phase 2 options to robustly enroll Harrison Park MS in Fall 2022, reduce overcrowding at Franklin HS, and adjust boundaries and assignments to balance enrollment and opportunity across Southeast.



Problems/Obstacles This Recommendation Creates

Deferred decisions that need action in Phase 2:

- Delaying K-5 conversion for Creston
- Locations of Chinese DLI programs (K-5, MS and HS)
- Viability

Obstacle that needs immediate action:

Bridger's neighborhood middle school needs an interim location for 2021-22.



Priorities for Phase 2

- Determining middle school feeder assignment for Creston so it can convert to K-5 in Fall 2022
- Providing a location for Harrison Park K-5 students upon conversion of Harrison Park to MS
- Establishing feeder patterns that support robust enrollment across middle schools
- Addressing overcrowding at Franklin High School
- Considering DLI placement to strengthen programs, serve native speakers more equitably, and complement neighborhood programs
- Addressing low enrollment at some K-5 schools

To accomplish all this, we will need clear direction from PPS on several key points, including specific enrollment targets and location criteria for focus option programs.
