

Enrollment and Program BalancingOPTIONS FOR ADDRESSING CRESTON

GRADE 6-8 PLACEMENT IN 2021-22

Southeast Guiding Coalition

BACKGROUND

The Phase 1 recommendation was presented to the PPS Board of Education on January 12 for initial comment and feedback. The recommendation was generally supported. However, there was interest in exploring potential options for enrolling Creston grades 6-8 in a middle school starting in 2021-22.

The Advisory Team has developed the following supplemental options for feedback from the Southeast Guiding Coalition. Recognizing there is very little time to consider these options, the Advisory Team is not seeking a formal recommendation from the Guiding Coalition.

UPDATED ENROLLMENT ESTIMATES FOR PHASE 1 RECOMMENDATION

- The supplemental options described below are based on October 2020 student enrollment counts and/or the PSU 2021-22 forecast. These data sets will produce slightly different results than shown in prior SEGC scenarios and options, which used actual 2019-20 enrollment.
- Enrollment based on rising 6-8 graders includes students who will make other choices, so is likely
 an over-estimate of future population. However, it does serve to partially offset the <u>new school</u>
 <u>effect</u>, which resulted in higher than expected enrollment at six other modernized PPS buildings in
 the past five years.
- The functional capacity for Kellogg MS has been revised from 803 to 765 based on as-built plans that were not available earlier in the process.
- The supplemental options below set aside 25 seats at Kellogg for potential Bridger neighborhood students. The number is based on the current Bridger 5-7 graders who live south of Division Street and may have priority to enroll at Kellogg instead of Harrison Park. PPS staff will work with the Bridger community to solidify a plan for all Bridger neighborhood students.
- Non-neighborhood counts for Arleta and Creston include 27 students enrolled in Special Ed focus
 classrooms whose assignments will be determined by Special Education. Additionally, the data
 currently includes 5th graders in the Deaf and Hard of Hearing classroom at Creston, who will be
 assigned to Mt. Tabor MS. Adjustments will be made as new information becomes available.

Figure 1: Enrollment estimates and utilization % for affected middle schools



SUPPLEMENTAL OPTION A

Spanish DLI remains at Mt. Tabor MS and all Creston grade 6-8 students attend Kellogg MS.

Potential Impacts

- Spanish DLI is not unified at Kellogg MS
- Mt. Tabor remains crowded
- Higher enrollment at Kellogg (Creston grades 6-8 has more students than Mt. Tabor Spanish DLI)

SUPPLEMENTAL OPTION B

Non-neighborhood students currently enrolled in Arleta, Lent and Marysville grades 5-7 are not included in Kellogg MS; Creston neighborhood 6-8 students attend Kellogg MS.

Potential Impacts

- Higher enrollment at Kellogg
- Precise impact for students in Special Ed focus classrooms to be determined
- Breaks with standard used to open other new middle schools in 2016 and 2018
- Increased enrollment at other schools (specifics to be determined)

SUPPLEMENTAL OPTION C

Creston grade 6-8 students are enrolled in Hosford MS or Kellogg MS based on their location north or south of Powell Boulevard. Non-neighborhood students currently enrolled at Creston will be assigned to their neighborhood schools, with the potential exception for students in the Special Ed focus classroom.

Potential Impacts

- Kellogg opens at capacity, with no room for new school effect
- Hosford would be overcrowded
- Final boundary changes may differ from this variant
