The Vanport Mosaic--in collaboration with Master Artist Michael Bernard Stevenson Jr. and seasoned artist/educator Andrea White--proposes Fred Hampton Summer, a four full days a week, eight-week experience (June 28--August 19) at the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Elementary School for students in grades 3-8. Young people are whole people who have distinctive desires and aspirations. It is the responsibility of their elders and educators to cultivate, communicate, and build comprehensive understanding, while holding space for individual student needs--weaving the range of these diverse perspectives into a strong student learning cohort. The ideology and culture of Fred Hampton Summer will be directly informed by studying The Black Panthers, activists Kent Ford and Fred Hampton, The Rainbow Coalition, schools in Vanport and Guild's Lake (two local wartime temporary housing projects), as well as the namesake of the school itself, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Among these histories are exemplary ideas of discipline, organization, intercultural solidarity, and youth led initiatives in action. These principles will set the stage for our moral and ethical values as faculty and students work through our community agreements and codes of conduct.

The study of these historical groups and events will be nuanced with exploration of contemporary artists, community organizing, and other youth-friendly sources that are likely familiar to students, like the 2018 Black Panther film starring Chadwick Boseman and the 2021 graphic novel history The Black Panther Party by Portland writer David F. Walker. Leveraging their new or refreshed understanding of the cultures being referenced in these contemporary sources, students will learn about how to conduct themselves in our cohort as well as think through the complicated challenges that arise in the material.

The Vanport Mosaic--in collaboration with Master Artist Michael Bernard Stevenson Jr. and seasoned artist/educator Andrea White--proposes Fred Hampton Summer, a four full days a week, eight-week experience (June 28–August 19) at the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Elementary School for students in grades 3–8. Young people are whole people who have distinctive desires and aspirations. It is the responsibility of their elders and educators to cultivate, communicate, and build comprehensive understanding, while holding space for individual student needs--weaving the range of these diverse perspectives into a strong student learning cohort. The ideology and culture of Fred Hampton Summer will be directly informed by studying The Black Panthers, activists Kent Ford and Fred Hampton, The Rainbow Coalition, schools in Vanport and Guild's Lake (two local wartime temporary housing projects), as well as the namesake of the school itself, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Among these histories are exemplary ideas of discipline, organization, intercultural solidarity, and youth led initiatives in action. These principles will set the stage for our moral and ethical values as faculty and students work through our community agreements and codes of conduct.

The study of these historical groups and events will be nuanced with exploration of contemporary artists, community organizing, and other youth-friendly sources that are likely familiar to students, like the 2018 Black Panther film starring Chadwick Boseman and the 2021 graphic novel history The Black Panther Party by Portland writer David F. Walker. Leveraging their new or refreshed understanding of the cultures being referenced in these contemporary sources, students will learn about how to conduct themselves in our cohort as well as think through the complicated challenges that arise in the material.
