Dear Stephenson Families,

Our community has become increasingly aware of the natural disasters that are happening around the world. We would like to be prepared for any disaster that might possibly occur in our neighborhood. Since we love and care for your children, the Stephenson staff are asking for families to prepare an emergency kit for each child to be kept at school. Please look out for a letter that will be sent home early next week. The letter will contain a list of items to include in each emergency kit.

Student Emergency/Comfort Kit

In a one gallon zip-lock bag labeled with your child's first name, last name and room number on the outside of the bag, please include the following:

- □ Change of underwear
- □ Two 6 oz. cans or plastic bottles of juice no boxes please

□ 3 small packets of snacks that are commercially sealed and preserved (e.g., dry fruit, beef jerky, granola bars, crackers, etc.) - NO loose snacks that could attract pests

□ Small flashlight with fresh batteries

□ A note from you explaining to your child to follow the teachers' directions, that you will pick him/her up as

- soon as you can, to remain calm and not to worry
- □ A family picture

Make sure that your phone numbers are always up to date with the office. Please turn in your child's kit in to their classroom teacher by Friday, November 4th.



Dear Parents and Guardians:

In the event of a major emergency, Stephenson is asking parents and guardians to please prepare a personal emergency/comfort kit for each student. This one gallon zip-lock bag will contain the items listed on the back of this page. An example of a completed kit is in the display case by the front doors.

Please turn in your child's kit in to their <u>classroom teacher by Monday, November 4th, 2019.</u> This is also a good time to make sure that your emergency contacts are updated in the office if you haven't already done so this year. Remember that a child may only be released to a person listed on the registration form that is filled out at the beginning of each school year. The nonlocal contact is requested so that if the local phone lines become inoperable, long distance lines may still be available.

These kits will be stored at school and will be returned to you at the end of the school year for you to save and replenish for the next school year. Please contact the office if you need assistance providing a kit for your child.

We would greatly appreciate anyone who is willing to donate some extra items (i.e. water and snacks) for families who need assistance.

If you have any questions or concerns about providing this kit, please contact your child's teacher.

TAG News: Thinking about TAG for your student? TAG stands for Talented and Gifted. Students can be identified as TAG in one, two or three areas, which are reading, math and intellectual. The identification comes when a student scores in the 95th or above percentile on nationally normed tests that are selected by the TAG department. You can begin by opening a dialogue with your child's teacher. Students can be nominated for TAG by parents and/or teachers. A nomination form acts like a permission slip to have your child tested in the area (s) you select. If you'd like to nominate your child



for TAG you can pick up a nomination form from the TAG bulletin board. You can also access the nomination form from the TAG website: <u>https://www.pps.net/Page/3884</u> All nomination forms are due to your child's teacher or the TAG facilitator (Courtney Pawol) no later than **November 26th.** Late applications are not accepted.

If you're the parent of a 4th or 5th grader, your child's state testing scores from the previous year may also qualify your child for TAG.

- The TAG department has mailed the postcards identifying students whose 2019 state testing scores were in the 95th or above percentile in reading and/or math. If you received this post card and would like your child to be identified as TAG in reading and/or math you will still need to complete a nomination form, which you can pick up from the TAG bulletin board located outside of Ms. Saunder's room. You can also print one from the TAG website. There is no additional testing required in those areas (reading and math) if you received one of those postcards.
- Please note you may have received one of the post cards even if your child is already identified as TAG in reading or math. If this is the case, you do not need to complete a nomination form. Once you've been identified, you do not need to be reidentified. TAG identifications stay with a child through 12th grade.
