

When Inclement Weather Hits, Here's How PPS Keeps You Posted...

The long-range weather forecast for Portland is calling for a mild winter, but if you've been in Portland for any length of time, you know forecasts can be, well, only so accurate. If you have students in Portland Public Schools, please get to know the ways we inform you when weather forces closures and delays.

Three ways we send messages to families about delays, closures and other weather-related decisions:



☐ **Email:** An automated message will be sent to the email address you listed in your child's registration. The message will be translated into our five supported languages.

□ **Text message:** You will receive a text message on your cell phone, but first you'll have to opt in to the SchoolMessenger system by texting "Yes" or just "Y" to 68453. Note: If you opt in, you will still receive an auto-dialer call.

"HEADING OFF" HEAD LICE

It's that time of year again when head lice may spread. Remind students not to share clothes or hats, and keep their heads apart (lice do not jump, but they can crawl from one head to another). Looking for information and/or resources? Check out the MESD website http://www.mesd.k12.or.us/Page/510 in the Parent Information tab.

Live lice survive for 30-35 days. An adult female louse produces 4-6 eggs, or nits, per day. The nits hatch after 7-10 days. Symptoms of head lice include itching, scratching, a rash on the nape of the neck, and the appearance of live bugs. The nits are often mistaken for dandruff. The difference is that dandruff flakes off, whereas nits stick to the hair shaft and will not move.

Regardless of the treatment that is chosen to get rid of live lice, manual removal of nits on a daily basis is the only effective guarantee to get rid of an infestation. Yes, it's admittedly time consuming. However, all parents are recommended and encouraged to do a head check on their student at least once a week.

Parent Discussion Distinguishing - Flu vs. Cold

Distinguishing Flu vs. Cold Influenza (or flu) is different from a cold. Both a cold and the flu are respiratory illnesses, yet they are caused by different types of viruses with different symptoms. The flu usually comes on suddenly. To recognize flu symptoms, remember Flu F.A.C.T.S. (Fever, Aches, Chills, Tiredness, and Sudden onset). Children can have additional flu symptoms that are rare in adults, including vomiting and diarrhea.

Flu Facts Children are two to three times more likely than adults to get sick with the flu. Children can pass the flu virus to others for a period of more than seven days after symptoms start. On average, one-third of family members in families with school-age children are infected with the flu each year.

Typically, influenza affects five to 20 percent of the U.S. population each year. While the flu season is unpredictable, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) notes that the flu can peak anytime between November and March.

Flu Transmission Schools are a prime location for the flu virus to attack and spread. It can be challenging to prevent children from getting the flu during the school year because: Flu is respiratory illness. Flu viruses are spread mainly by respiratory droplets from coughing, sneezing and talking. Droplets can spread to others up to about six feet away and may land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby or possibly be inhaled into the lungs. Less often, a person may get the flu by touching a surface or object that has flu virus on it and then touching their own mouth or nose. Schools are a prime location for the flu virus to spread. It can be challenging to prevent children from getting the flu during the school year so it's important to take preventative measures.

Preventing the Flu 1) Vaccination is the cornerstone of flu prevention. The CDC recommends that everyone 6 months and older get a flu vaccine. 2) Good hygiene habits help control spread of the flu virus. Teach your child these tips to help prevent the spread of flu virus. a. Cover your coughs and sneezes with the inside of your elbow or a tissue b. Wash your hands with soap and water c. Avoid touching your face — especially your eyes, mouth, and nose — as it can spread germs 3) Antiviral flu medicines prescribed by a doctor directly attack the flu virus and are an important adjunct to vaccination for flu prevention and control.

What to do if Your Child Gets the Flu Even with preventative measures, sometimes you or your child may still get the flu. If your child has flu symptoms, schedule an appointment with your pediatrician. Your pediatrician may prescribe an antiviral flu medicine that directly attacks the flu virus. Antivirals are an important adjunct to vaccination for flu prevention and control.

If your child gets the flu, it's important that they spend time resting. Keep your child at home for at least 24 hours after his or her fever is gone.



Here is How You Can Help:


*Select a snowman tag from the main office front window starting 12/2/19, purchase the gift and return the wrapped gift to the main office with tag attached by 12/19/19.

2020 STATE TESTING

As we close out the calendar year it is time we think about **STATE TESTING**. All 3rd-5th grade families will be given a copy of the **2019-2020** Annual Notice for Statewide Tests which has all the information you will need. A number of tests are administered to students each year.

They Include:

- *English Language Proficiency Tests (ELPA) given to students who receive English as a Second Language services in grades Kindergarten Fifth Grade.
- *Oregon Summative Assessments English Language Arts (OSAS) given to all students in grades 3-5.
- *Oregon Summative Assessments Mathematics (OSAS) given to all students in grades 3-5.
- *Oregon Science Assessment given to students in grade 5

Oregon House Bill 2655 allows parents to "opt" their child out from all or some of the testing.

Coach Requirements:

- Pass Background Check (paid for by GOTR)
- Head Coach = 21+ and Female
- Assistant Coach = 18+ can be Male or Female
- New Coaches = 5 hr. National Coach Training
- Returning Coaches = 2 hr. Kick Off (in February)
- CPR/First Aid Trained 2 coaches per team
- Preseason meeting with Site Liaison (February)
- Online training in January and mid-season

Coaches can be caregivers, teachers, school staff, parents, community members, etc.





Over the last several weeks members of the Wilson Conceptual Master Planning Committee(CMPC) have been working on ideas of what a future Wilson High School would look like after a modernization. This forum provides an opportunity for the greater community to weigh in on those ideas and to share their feelings and concerns with the project team and their school board representative before they are finalized and presented to the full Board.

What Is Conceptual Master Planning?

The conceptual master planning process will determine each school's overall program needs, site layout, and estimated costs for historic modernization vs. new construction. The early planning effort will help us more accurately determine the cost estimates for the modernization or the rebuilding of that school. This information will help PPS in the planning of future capital improvement bonds.




