## From Principal Galindo



#### Strive, Shine, Succeed

Dear Stephenson Learning Community,

This week officially was the start of the second half of our school year as well as the Black History Month in our schools and across the nation. At Stephenson we work as a school to try and keep a multiple perspectives in student learning and integrate this effort in all of our work, this however is always a reminder about how intentionally we are accomplishing that and what we can do to improve.

We wrapped up our 2nd quarter of CDL and teachers used their planning day to review assessments, double check their records of completed assignments and get started on report cards. Whether we are providing instruction virtually or in-person, we are still responsible to teach grade level's standards and record students' progress toward those standards. I know some of you have questions about the grading process and report cards as it relates to CDL. Since this will be our first report card this year, I wanted to clarify the process. All students enrolled at Stephenson have attended their homeroom and/or learning center classes on some level. Therefore, ALL Stephenson students will receive a report card in the mail.

- If a student has been participating regularly in CDL then his/her/their teachers will have information to evaluate their progress toward the grade level standards for each subject area and will communicate their strengths and challenges for each subject area at this time.
- Students will only receive a progress mark for the subject areas in which they DID • participate.
- Students will receive an "NE" for classes they did not attend. This indicates that the teacher has no evidence (or too little evidence) to adequately evaluate progress. This does not penalize your child but does allow you to know why they did not receive a grade.
- Students are receiving grades for PE, Music, Dance and Library/Technology at this time.

## **3rd-5th Grade MAP Testing...**

**Stephenson 3rd, 4th, 5th Grade District Testing February 16th to 19th**: During the week of February 16th, students in grades 3 to 5 will take the MAP Growth test, which is a low stakes District assessment administered by individual teachers. It will cover both reading and math. This test measures growth of a student over time, and at Stephenson our students start taking MAP Growth in 3rd grade. Students cannot pass or fail this test -- rather, the test is designed to adapt to a student's learning level. The test will tell teachers



what students know today, and what they are ready to learn. Given the challenges of learning from home,

MAP Growth test results will be especially helpful for us this year.

## This test will not affect grades.

Students will begin preparing for the test during the week of January 19th. We will work to make sure their devices are ready for the test, and that they know how to log on and navigate through the test questions. The district is asking that parents play a role in administering this test by being available to help troubleshoot for students experiencing difficulties logging into the test. Teachers will send out their testing schedule to you in advance so you can plan accordingly. **Please do not help students answer any content questions.**

## **OBOB Information for 3rd-5th grade Students...**

Hello Stephenson OBOB participants,

We are now able to begin the **Oregon Battle of the Books** (OBOB) program. Our school building is still under construction but the library portion is complete. We can start library services. Thank you for your patience.

We will be checking in with the 3rd - 5th grade students this week to begin organizing

teams and accessing which OBOB books they need. We do have some of the books available in the Stephenson library. Next week during technology and library classes, We will demonstrate and explain how to place library holds for checkout. We will also email you with this procedure and how pickups will be arranged. Due to current circumstances, books will be checked out for at least 2 weeks and when they return, will be quarantined for at least a week. Book pick up, drop off or exchanges will probably occur through a window, outside or at a designated area at a scheduled time. You can also email us your book requests and questions. There will be more about this subject soon.

#### Things to consider and need to know:

- Students should be forming teams with 2 5 members. We can also help with this process.
- Each team will need a parent coach or an adult to organize outside of school online meetings, manage the team's reading, book needs, track their progress and eventually practice battle questions.
- Once teams are formed, the teams should meet (online) together to discuss the books and their progress.
- Students should be reading the books from the booklist: OBOB 2020-21 3rd-5th Division Book List
- We should determine which books you have or still need. Please let me know.

We are hosting an OBOB after-school book club for **3rd-5th grade students** to get the students started . Any student who has an interest is welcomed. The meetings will be on Mondays from 2:30pm-3:30pm on school days. There is no meeting on Monday, February 15th due to President's holiday.
