Dear Stephenson Learning Community,

The first week of school went very well. The enthusiasm is high and I have been able to visit classrooms and spend time with students and staff. I have introduced myself to many of our new 1st-5th grade students. Our current school-wide enrollment is 372 students. This number is 22 students more than we were last year at this time. We will welcome our Kinder students on Tuesday. Currently, we have 57 students enrolled in Kindergarten which allows for small classroom sizes in the three K classrooms.

We are almost fully staffed for the 2019-2020 school year. I did receive communication from HR this week regarding our .5 School Secretary. Sarah Gretz has accepted the position and officially began on Wednesday this week. Our new nurse is Mitchell Henderson and he will be at Stephenson on Tuesdays and our School Health Assistant Shawna Carstairs will be working M-F, 8:30am-1:30pm. All new and returning staff will be introduced during our **Back to School Night on Wednesday, September 18th**. A flyer for the event is attached in today's FNN.

Two of the five Instructional Assistants have been recommended to HR and I'm waiting to hear when they can officially begin. I'm still working to fill the other three IA positions and I should finish up early next week. The five Instructional Assistants will be supporting our 3rd-5th grade classrooms.

This is a reminder of our new transportation policy: All kindergarten students must be met at their bus stop at the end of each day. Kinder students must wear a bus tag all year long. The tag must have their bus stop and emergency contact information on one side, and information about who is meeting the child on the other side. (For example: Mom and Dad and their names, Grandma Teri, get off with older brother Thomas on the bus, etc.). Drivers will be looking for bus tags. If no one is at the stop to meet the child, the student will be returned back to school. Parents may opt-out of this requirement by informing the school.

Our PTA Welcome Back to School Picnic was Thursday, August 29th. Thank you for attending our first school community event of the year. It was very nice to see many families enjoying themselves. Back to School Night for Parents/Guardians only is Wednesday, September 18th at 6:30pm. SCCA will not be providing evening care and the event will end at 8:00pm.

Thank you families for waiting in the cafeteria with your child both morning and afterschool. This helps with student line up, teacher pick up and drop off. 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th graders are doing a great job waiting in the cafeteria until 7:45am each morning before walking down to their classrooms. Please remember you only need to sign in/out in the main office if you are volunteering and staying longer in the building. Otherwise, if you are simply walking your child to class and then leaving you do not need a visitor/volunteer tag and exit through the main front doors of the building.

We are asking ALL parents/guardians to exit out the front doors versus exiting out the deer doors or west end building doors. We continue to work on student safety and having only one set of doors for entrance and exit is best practice unless in case of emergency where we would need to use all building outside doors for evacuation procedures.

Students will have an opportunity to review bus safety on Thursday, September 5th during our S.T.O.P.P.S. drill. All K-5 students will practice loading and unloading procedures. Bus drivers and staff will review bus safety rules with students. Our first fire drill took place this week. Our goal is to clear the building within 1 minute. Friday's time was 55 seconds which is outstanding for our first drill of the year. We will continue to have fire drills and earthquake drills through-out the year. Teachers will continue to instruct students on all safety drills through the month of September. Our next fire drill and earthquake drill is Friday, September 6th at 9:15am.

Please join us for our 1st PTA meeting of the year on Tuesday, September 10th at 8:00am in the staff book room. I know for some of you this time does not work. However, October 8th and November 12th PTA meetings are in the evening.
