Harvest of the Month – WATERMELONS: Every Thursday in September, all our school kitchens and cafeterias will be celebrating melons as our Harvest of the Month. From the Library....

Hello Stephenson Families,

Welcome back! I hope you had a good summer. I am glad to be back for the new school year. In the library, students have started the usual rules and expectations, book check out procedures and using technology resources safely. Students in grades 2nd through 5th grade have been given the "Technology and Network



Acceptable Use Policy" form that will be sent home. Although some of the language might be catered more for upper grades, our students have a range of various technical knowledge and abilities. It is important to address appropriate behavior while working with technology at school. Please review the form with your child, sign it and send it back to their classroom teachers. They may also return it to the library.

Some of the topics students will learn in the library this year will about book genre and the library classifications. With their classroom core curriculum, students will know how to research a topic. They will use critical thinking to identify goods sources. I am hoping to provide some social-emotional strategies, use conflict resolution and develop a positive culture through storytelling. For technology, K-3 will have the resources from the TechSmart grant as well as opportunities to learn navigation, typing and access ebooks. Additionally 4th and 5th will discuss digital citizenship, work with HTML coding and use elements of STEM design.

I look forward to working with your children in digital and media literacy this year. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me.
