Restorative Justice is a philosophy grounded in the belief that positive, healthy relationships help us thrive. When we do things that impact others and create harm to those relationships, it is our individual and collective responsibility to make things right. Restorative Practices are the skills and processes that help us build, maintain, and repair relationships to form healthy, supportive & inclusive communities. In a school community the philosophy and practice shift the punitive nature of discipline towards a relational and community response to hold us accountable for



behaviors that create harm in supportive and inclusive ways. But first, we have to build a strong community, filled with authentic and real relationships between students, staff, parents, and caregivers. Our administrators and several staff members will be attending a two-day training around this philosophy so that we may best utilize these practices at Astor.


