**TechSmart Grant-** Exciting news!! Astor was chosen to receive this innovative grant next school year. The grant is for grades K-3, and is an opportunity to provide more resources to students, along with more computers for K-3. More information is on the way!

**Attendance-** Thank you parents and students for focusing on attendance for the month of January. Many students improved their overall attendance by as much as 10%. Students who were able to be at school 97% or more received an award and bracelet in K-5, and over 70 Middle Schoolers received an extra recess and treat for 97%+ attendance for the month of January.
