

### Autism Acceptance Month

Black, Hispanic and Asian or Pacific Islander children were more likely to be identified with ASD than White children for the first time in ADDM.

#### An Increase in Autism Diagnosis Rates

The Centers for Disease Control released the Autism and Developmental Disabilities Monitoring (ADDM) has updated the prevalence of ASD. 1 in 36 children has been identified with autism spectrum disorder (ASD).

In March, The Autistic Self Advocacy Network (ASAN) released a statement, "The ADDM report indicates that our diagnosis practices are starting to reflect the diversity of the autistic community. While the challenges posed by COVID remind us that we will continue to need to work to improve access, it is good news that many autistic people who have been overlooked in the past can increasingly get the recognition and support they need."
