#### Talkin' About Our Feelings

Welcome to October, Access Atoms. For our mindfulness practice this month, we wanted to discuss our feelings, specifically how we go about checking-in on one another. Often, we hear people ask "How are you?" When we ask someone 'how' they feel, the other person often will generalize their state of being to 'good', 'bad', or maybe 'so-so'. These are one-word responses that don't invite much follow up. The question 'how' is asked so often that we often have automatic responses at the ready and don't actually think about our feelings.



We would like to challenge you to ask "What are you feeling?" instead. So what's the difference? By reframing the question to name the emotions you are feeling, you have to give yourself time and identify them. When we name individual emotions, you give them (and by extension yourself), space to be seen. Take a moment to reflect on those emotions and breathe.

# Free At-Home Tests: @School & Your Mailbox

The PPS Health Services Team is partnering with OHA again to offer onsite diagnostic testing as well as a limited number of take home tests for students upon request. These testing options will be available in early October. Families will need to be sure to complete the testing permission form which can be requested from the school office.

In addition, the U.S. government has resumed the Free At-Home test program: covid.goc/tests. The program stopped in May of 2023 when the pandemic was declared no longer a public health crisis by the government.

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#### Medications during Outdoor School

Bring all student medications with you and turn them in to your teacher before boarding the bus to Outdoor School. Rescue medication, such as inhaler or epipen may stay with the student, but still must be logged by the teacher. All other medications will be stored and administered by the nurse at the Outdoor School site.

- All medications must be in <u>original</u> <u>packaging</u> (Rx or OTC) with specific written instructions for use. we are unable to distribute unmarked medications to the student
- All medications must be listed with detailed instructions given on the Health History form prior to coming to Outdoor School
- Please send all prescription medications your child uses (including inhalers and treatments for allergic reactions).
- Vitamins/supplements (such as melatonin or daily vitamins) require a note from the health care provider
