THE SCHOOL & COMMUNITY

Portland Public Schools is an urban school district in Portland, Oregon. With approximately 49,000 students in 78 schools, it is one of the largest school district in the Pacific Northwest.

Roosevelt High School is one of seven comprehensive high schools in Portland Public Schools. We serve neighborhood students and families grades 9-12. Roosevelt is the most ethnically diverse high school in the state of Oregon. Roosevelt is considered a Federal Title I Priority school and in 2014 received a three year CEP grant that qualified all students for Free and Reduced Lunch.

Roosevelt is located in the community of St Johns which sits in North Portland on the tip of a peninsula where the Willamette and Columbia Rivers come together. Because of its location within the city, St Johns is often referred to as a small town within a larger city.

ACADEMICS

Roosevelt High School offers a comprehensive selection of courses in the areas of Language Arts, Mathematics, Fine Arts, Career/Technical Education, Science, Social Science, and World Languages. Students are graded using proficiency-based standards. Courses are taught by highly qualified teachers including 4 National Board Certified teachers (Roosevelt has more than any other school in the district) and the 2012 Oregon Teacher of the Year.

Roosevelt students are expected and strongly encouraged to take a rigorous, college-prep schedule of classes each year of high school which includes a full schedule for juniors and at least 6 out of 8 periods for seniors.

Advanced Placement & Dual-Credit Courses

Roosevelt High School encourages students to take advanced courses when they feel prepared for the rigor and challenges these courses offer.

Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID)

AVID is a nationwide, research based program that focuses on underserved students in the academic middle. Through structured support in advanced reading, writing, and research students learn the skills to be college and AP ready. Roosevelt has a strong AVID program going into it's 10th year with 28% of the student population electing to take AVID for the 2016 - 2017 academic year. Most students take AVID all 4 years of high school.

Spanish Language Arts

Over the past 18 years Roosevelt High School has developed a rigorous program of study for students to develop their academic Spanish skills to ultimately prepare them for upper division college Spanish coursework. The program serves students who either speak Spanish at home or come from a Spanish immersion program. The courses develop the students' reading, writing, and oral fluency through Spanish Language Arts classes similar to the in-depth study of English in Language Arts classes. Freshmen and sophomores take introductory level Spanish Language Arts courses and juniors and seniors take AP Spanish Language & Culture and AP Spanish Literature & Culture courses, which expand their academic skills to college level and beyond. Students consistently pass the two Spanish AP exams with 98% passing with a 3 or higher (average score of 4.02) in AP Spanish Language and 78% in AP Spanish Literature (average score of 3.2) in 2016.
