Before moving to Jason Lee, he served as a school climate coach at Ockley Green Middle School and Chief Joseph Elementary, where he was responsible for such initiatives as restorative justice, PBIS (Positive Behavior Interventions, and Supports) and student council.

Prior to joining PPS, Blake served as a Peace Corps Volunteer. He earned a Bachelor of Science in Biology, with honors, from Longwood University, and a Master of Teaching and Initial Administrator License from the University of Portland. In his free time, Blake enjoys spending time with his family including his two daughters, running, and gardening.
