Elementary, a Mandarin immersion school. She oversaw the Response to Intervention Program and supported student discipline within the PBIS (Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports) and Restorative Justice frameworks.

At Sabin K-8, Cindi supported grade level teams in PYP and MYP curriculum, working with other PPS International Baccalaureate schools. At Abernethy Elementary, she oversaw the school's Special Education and Professional Learning Community teams. At Woodlawn PK-8, Cindi helped lead the Title I school in managing behavior while leading professional development.

Cindi started her career as a first-grade teacher in Aurora, Colorado, before returning to her home state of Oregon in 1991. She served as a teacher at elementary grade levels in the Beaverton, Lake Oswego and West Linn/Wilsonville school districts. She also served as an instructor and clinical coordinator at the Lewis & Clark Graduate School of Education and Counseling from 2009 to 2014.

Cindi earned a Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education from Oregon State University; a Master of Arts in Teaching from Lewis & Clark College; and a Doctorate of Education in Leadership from Lewis & Clark.
