He developed a structure that led to an increase in student attendance and a decrease in discipline while utilizing a \$10 million grant to instill innovations to support personalized learning, competency-based education, and environmental and social justice.

Before that, Steven served as principal of McReynolds Middle School. Under his leadership, the school tied for first in Texas in academic growth among schools with similar low socioeconomic status. During his five years as a Houston district principal, he was twice given an Excellence in Leadership Award, recognized from among 300 principals in the district.

Steven started his career as a science teacher in Texas, and has also served as a department chair, curriculum specialist in instructional technology, assistant principal, and director of professional learning.

Steven earned a Bachelor of Science in Biology from the University of Texas at Austin, a Master's in Education Administration from Lamar University, and has completed his coursework for a Doctor of Education in Educational Leadership from Texas A&M University.
