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- 2025 PPS School Bond Presentation Presenter: Christy Splitt, <u>csplitt@pps.net</u> @7:30 (10 min)
   Christy Splitt Parent at Hayhurst and representing SW on the school board as interim member, background working in the legislature, school funding advocacy work, and former teacher.
  - a. Portlanders will be voting on a \$1.8 Billion School Bond Renewal this May. This bond focuses on high school modernization and this Bond will fund Cleveland and Ida B. Wells modernization as well as additional funding for Jefferson modernization. It will also fund some Curriculum, tech spending, and other building issues for middle and elementary schools (HVAC, etc)
    - i. Renews our current tax rate
    - ii. Delivers critical repairs to schools across Portland
    - iii. Completes the modernization of our high schools

  - b. Motion made by Lisa Flood to official endorse bond as a PTA. Eliz Roser seconded the motion. All in attendance at that point in the meeting voted Yes (Tracy, Eliz, David, Lisa, Jessica, Cara, Jory, Josie,, Holly); motion passed.
- **Principal's Update** (20 minutes)
  - Working on schedules for next year
  - o Upcoming events: Ren Faire, Author Visit, Middle School Dance, and Talent Show
  - April Principal's coffee with be a hybrid (in person and virtual)
  - Bathrooms
    - Aaron and staff has received, listened to, and discussed parent feedback about how this was communicated. After the concrete steps below, Aaron has seen improvements in the conditions of the bathroom this week
    - Concrete steps taken to improve this thus far:
      - Devin, Margaret, and Aaron have pushed into all middle school classes to reset expectations around behavior and
      - Sign in/Sign out process now in place for all middle schoolers
      - There are cameras outside the restrooms as well, but the sign outs are thought be helpful to promote student accountability
      - Staff have a schedule to rotate into bathrooms every 45 min
        - Helps call custodian more quickly as mess begets mess
        - Limits number of students that might be involved in any destruction behavior if investigations are necessary
        - Helps facilities stay on top of minor repairs
      - Parents are having discussions with students
    - Other ideas/feedback:

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- Can we apply consequence to kids that are responsible? There are both restorative and more traditional code of conduct consequences that have been used but it is pretty tricky with bathrooms given the sensitive nature of things and student privacy
- Question from parent about how many working doors on elementary school bathrooms; there have been chronic problem with ADA stall in 4th and 5th grade hallway but this was addressed recently. All are currently functional per Aaron and he will double check asap.
- Suggestion from parent to address expectations with elementary students as well. Aaron took that feedback to heart and will look into this.
- Parent asked if PTA could buy hand dryers to avoid papertowels clogging toilets, Aaron is looking into this
- Parent suggested notes/banner of appreciation for custodian, could be a leadership student project. Aaron to check in with McBride about it
- This has also brought up more general themes, questions, and feedback around consequences for behavior at ACCESS
  - Principal reiterated they are committed to restorative justice/practices but these don't t take the place of other forms of code of conduct or consequences
  - Often the restorative practices are the most visible while Code of Conduct discipline is very private and if Aaron's doing his job well no one but student and their family will know about them. We discussed that it is important for parents to reinforce this with students if they feel that other kids are "getting away" with behaviors and help students understand that we may not always have the full story.
  - Parent suggested a restorative justice practice that allows kids to say how an event has affecting them (ex of child limiting water and not using bathrooms at school with current bathroom situation given) without identifying perpetrator, but having more generalities
  - Parent asked what we could do as a community/PTA help kids to instill
     Pride in school building
  - Parent suggested PTA could potentially fund an outside organization to assist with teaching executive functioning/emotional regulation skills for students and/or a parent series around executive function (especially as we lose a counselor next year) as some of these behaviors may result from impulsivity or emotional regulation deficits. PTA will look into this.
     Aaron was open to this and also poses that parent volunteers might be

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able to help with more monitoring during times such as lunch, recesses, specials, etc.

Culture and Climate team that meets every other week. Includes ideas
for building a positive base and what the trouble spots that are coming
up are. Aaron plans to add a blurb about this in the weekly principal
letter to keep parents more uptodate about these types of issues
