1. 2015-16 Staffing Update

Access has hired a .5 Music teacher, Jason Fitch, whom we will share with Beverly Cleary. Mr. Fitch will teach **one section of Middle School Beginning Band**, **plus a rotation of Elementary Music specials to all 7 elementary classes.** More details to come about the Music program after we visit with the PPS Music department about instruments.

We have also hired a new 5th grade teacher, Brigid O'Hagan, who will team with Maggie Byrkit. Ms. O'Hagan is a Nationally Board Certified instructional specialist, recently at Woodlawn K-8, with significant experience in gifted education and international education. She has taught 20+ years.

Still outstanding to hire:

- .5-.6 MS Math/Lang Arts (6th grade)
- .75-1.0 Technology 1-8 + MS Math (currently .75, hoping for 1.0 with additional Foundation support)
- We will have wind instruments like trumpet, flute, trombone.
- Basic piano maintenance of piano for tuning regularly
- many students already take outside music. How will instruction support them in their growth as musicians? could a survey of student musical experience ahead of beginning instruction.
- 8th grade students will have choice of science electives but NO access to band. some 7th grade students will have access to middle school music.
- All 6th grade students will have 1 semester of PE and one semester of either band OR tech.
- a couple periods per week offer study skills classes

2. 2015-16 Admissions Update [D. Wood]

We admitted 97 new students for ACCESS in 2015-16: 1st (13), 2nd (4), 3rd (41), 4th (2), 5th (8), 6th (24), 7th (4), 8th (3). As of 6/5/15, 90 accepted; 2 offers from wait list were accepted; 2 offers outstanding; 3 more offers to be made from wait list.
