- President's call to order, welcome Lisa Flood (3 minutes)

- Mason Bee Program Overview (15-20 min) Debbie Conrad
  - 25 years of environmental ed background, program started a Llewylln. Since then, has created business called NatureHood. Information about Mason Bees shared. This curriculum is progressive for 2nd-5th grade, March-May each year. Students get a chance to raise mason bees and monitor the nesting process throughout the spring and get hands on science lessons. about important of plants, pollinators, and our

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interconnection to the natural world. Curriculum is tied to state standards when possible. Offered an Earth Day or Harvest Fest table. Used to be PTA grant funded, but now written into yearly PTA budget.

- Principal's Update/Counselor (10-20 minutes) Behavior policies, District wide cell phone policy
  - Science Bowl happening on Saturday, Read a thon just started, Spelling Bee going on now
  - Last day of quarter 1/24. Be sure to help students check grades in Canvas, especially if they are kids are taking classes for high school credits. Question about when grades are expected to posted in Canvas after work is turned in and Aaron reports there is an agreement that canvas grades are updated every 2 weeks.
  - 1/31 Dance for Middle School (6th-8th grade)
    - Tradition is fall, winter, spring dance that is school sponsored
    - Supported by PAT members that are volunteering their time, but there is no budget for it. Unsure if other middle schools have a staff budget.
    - Conversation about who "owns" or sponsors the event
  - PPS District Wide Policy to be cell phone free starting Academic year 2025-2026
    - All grades, all day including lunch
    - Board is currently exploring how to implement this
    - Per Aaron, at ACCESS staff has discussed this as well as far as implementation, solutions, and consequence. However, most teachers don't feel that cell phones are getting in the way of instruction at this point. When it happens, the phone is brought to the office and given back at the end of the day. Per his experience, socialization doesn't seem to be affected by cell phones either.
    - The challenge is actually the district issued Chrome books. Asked for more training on better ways to use Securly to monitor and help with classroom management, but teachers are currently monitoring usage with securly. Parent questioned if this is an issue that is unique to ACCESS and it seems that it might be per Aaron since cell phones aren't a big issue. Another parent mentioned that many ACCESS kids have figured out how to work around securly.
    - Discussed smart watches in a bit more detail as parents are concerned about tracking kids during long bus rides, etc.
  - Practice of Room Clears
    - 2 reasons for more room clears in current times
      - More inclusive practices
      - More school staff are trained in descalation techniques

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- Moving the class, rather than the student who has escalated, is safer and more effective. Though, this can result in an instructional time loss but usually it gets made up later in the day.
- Not the same as a lock down or lock out
- Aaron reported that he has gotten feedback from parents that the communication about a room clear is not always consistent. Need to be thoughtful and careful with confidentiality when communicating. They are talking about how to communicate more in the culture and climate committee
- Parent brought up that communication about physical altercations has also not always been consistent. Aaron stated he is working on this and parents of all students involved should be getting call/email.
