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## **All-School News**

Thank you for joining us during our open house on September 26th! It was so great to welcome so many families into the school.

Picture day is coming up this week on Thursday, October 5th! Your student's teacher sent home a photo order in their backpack. Please review the options for ordering pictures, and make sure to have your students' order form ready to turn in on picture day. Your student will have their photo taken even if you do not order a package. Class composites are complementary for every student, but they will be delivered at a later date.

The Fun-d Run is coming up on Thursday, October 12th! The fun-d run is an annual event where students collect pledges from families and friends for laps that they run around the playground. 1 lap is equal to ¼ of a mile, and students will run/walk for 30 minutes.

Funds raised with this event are used to support a variety of programs. In the past, we have used these funds to bring artists, musicians to perform at assemblies and other opportunities to strengthen school spirit. We also purchase supplies, equipment, and fund classroom experiences such as field trips and guest programs. Additionally, funds are used to upgrade technology, purchase books for classrooms and the library, and replenish PE and art supplies.

# Library

#### Amazon Donation:

This week we received an Amazon Donation of Book Bags with three books for each 1st and 2nd grader to take home!

Thank you to all those who came into the Library during Open House. I had a few questions about book check out, thus I wanted to include it

## Policy for checking out books:

- Kindergarten checks out 1 book at any given time.
- 1st Grade starts off with checking out 1 book in September, and once we get back into a routine they begin checking out 2 books in October at any given time.

- 2nd Grade checks out 2 books at any given time; only 1 Graphic Novel (GNOV) out at a time.
- **3rd Grade** checks out 3 books at any given time; only 2 Graphic Novels (GNOV) out at a time.
- 4th Grade checks out 4 books at any given time; only 2 Graphic Novels (GNOV) out at a time.
- **5th Grade** checks out 5 books at any given time; only 2 Graphic Novels (GNOV) out at a time.

## Procedures for returning books:


- 1. Students can return books on their Library day to a classroom return cart, which is brought up to their classroom the morning of their library. (See chart below to know which day is Library Day.)
- 2. Students can return books through the Return Slot located in the corner of our desk inside the Library.

## Procedures and Policies for dealing with late, missing, or damaged books:

- 1. Students are verbally reminded of which books they have checked out.
- 2. Students are only allowed the number of books allotted for their grade level to be checked out at any given time (i.e. 2nd grade is only allowed 2 books checked out at any given time).
- 3. After a few weeks or when a student requests, we will send home a print out with the student's name and titles that they need to look for.
- 4. Parents are emailed 3 days before books are due (via automated District email).
- Parents are emailed daily (when applicable) Two Weeks Overdue Notice (via automated District email).
- 6. Parents are emailed daily (when applicable) **Four Weeks Overdue Notice** (via automated District email).
- 7. Chief Joseph Library Staff will send out late notices and Fine Notices will be sent home (via folder in backpack and/or report cards) 2-3 times throughout the year.
- 8. If a book is lost or damaged, the student will be charged for a replacement book and parents will be emailed via automated district email. Parents can pay the replacement fee with exact change with Mrs. Hall, the Front Office or on SchoolPay, replace the book with another book of the same title, or have students work off the replacement fee (this needs to have written permission from parents before students can work off fines).

# **PE Update**

Students at Chief Joseph have been moving, playing and learning in PE class! This month students reviewed our recess games and are starting to learn new activities that involve problem solving and cooperative skills. We will be training for our school wide Fun(d) Run and hope you consider <u>volunteering!</u>

## **TAG NEWS:**

Hello Families.

I am Miss Michels, your building Talented and Gifted program's building coordinator. I will be presenting more information on the TAG program at our Back to School Night on September, 26, 2023.

Here are some updates for the 2023-2024 school year:

- -There is <u>no longer a fall window for acceleration</u>. Families inquiring about single subject acceleration for math can ask for a TAG plan for math and apply during the spring. We are not able to make any exceptions at this time.
- MAP scores will be used for TAG identification in reading and math. If your child is in grades 3-5, they will be tested for Reading and Math, and you will be notified if your child qualifies for TAG nomination. Students in grades 2 will all be tested for Intellectual giftedness in the classroom.
- -Parents and teachers may nominate their child in the areas of intellectual, reading, or math, if they are not tested in that area at their grade level. The best time to talk about TAG testing is generally during or before conferences. Please contact your child's teacher if you are considering nominating your child.
