Driving & Safety around the School

We want to take a moment to remind families that while driving around the school and the neighborhood it is important to drive at a safe speed and be alert. We are so lucky to be a neighborhood school with lots of students and families walking and biking to school and we want to keep everyone safe.

We are very excited that our safety patrol is up and running before and after school which will help with safe crossings. Because of the layout of our school, and our entrance and drop off procedures our safety patrol team sets up on N. Bryant street Monday - Friday and can be seen easily with their high visibility vests and and flags.

This is also a good time to remind families that for drop off in the morning when students are entering the school they do so from the locations below.



CJES - Entering the School

- Kindergarten students and families are encouraged to enter through the doors on the westside of the school between Arbor Lodge Park and the school
- 1st 2nd grade students are encouraged to enter through the doors near the library from the blacktop
- 3rd 5th grade students are encouraged to enter the school through the doors near the gym

• All students who wish to enter the school between 7:45 and 7:55 to either have breakfast or wait inside are welcome to be dropped off at the cafeteria door on the south side of the building.

Between 7:55am and 8:00am, we want to refrain from students entering through the front office. We don't have the staffing available to help with answering phones, ringing students into the building and assisting with any other last minute school needs. If a student and their family need to speak to office staff, you are of course welcome to come into the front office.


