School Volunteer Needs:

With the new bell times and the entry procedures changing at our school we have seen a large increase in the number of students coming into the cafeteria in the morning before school. We are in need of a few more adults to help support the cafeteria in the morning and at the lunch hour. Information on what we are thinking of is below:

Description of Cafeteria Volunteers:

Morning:

Time: 7:45-8:05

Duties: Provide general supervision, which includes greeting students, helping with containers, checking in with students to provide a positive start to the day.

Number of Volunteers: 1-2 per day

Lunch:

Time: 11:10-11:40, 11:40-12:15

Duties: Provide general supervision, which includes greeting students, helping with containers, checking in with students to provide a positive redirection if they are getting antsy.

Number of Volunteers: 1-2 per day

Training: Once we have a clear timeline, Ms. Whitaker will schedule a few 30 minute sessions to orient volunteers and give tips for how to be most supportive.

Volunteers in this role would need to be background checked and also need to check in at the office at the beginning of their shift. If you are interested in helping out, please email Ashley (agale@pps.net).

Attendance Process Update:

Please note an important change to the PPS attendance process. From the district: To enhance our focus on student safety, automated attendance calls through Remind will now begin at 9:30 AM instead of 10:30 AM. To avoid receiving a call, please report your child's absence to the school before 9:30 AM. Thank you for your cooperation.

Change in morning class entry!

Beginning January 21st, we are not staffing the 3-5 door (the door between the main hallway and the gym). We are needing to shift staffing around so that we have more staff in the cafeteria since we have had more students entering the school from that entrance.

1st through 5th grade will all enter the library doors. We have found that we need to shift staff to the cafeteria, as there are more students there, and fewer on the blacktop this year. 3-5 teachers, please let your students know about this change.

Library



This month in Library class students will have the opportunity to Read with The Rip City Remix Basketball Team! The Rip City Remix is the G League affiliate team for the Portland Trail Blazers. During Library the week of January 13-17, 2025, Mrs. Hall will be introducing the Remix Reading Program to K-5th graders and handing out student gameboards. The goal of this program is to encourage North Portland elementary school students to find joy in reading!

Students participating in the program will track their progress of reading for 20 minutes a day for five days starting January 20th through January 31st; one of the five days will be completed at school during Library class so students will only need to read four days outside of school. Students who complete the challenge will receive one free student ticket and discounted adult tickets for either the Educator Appreciation Game on February 10th or the Hispanic & Latinx Heritage Celebration Game on March 2nd. Mrs. Hall will be at the February 10th Educator Appreciation Game, where participating teachers will be recognized at the game and any participating students will be able to access post-game photos with Remix players. In addition to this, a few players will be coming to Chief Joseph the morning of Friday, January 31st to congratulate students and interact with a few library classes. Unfortunately, not all classes will get to participate on January 31st, as the players' schedules are pretty tight.

TAG Referrals

The Family and Teacher TAG referral window is now open and will remain open until January 10th, 2025. The goal of this second referral round is to identify students who may not have been referred during the Fall data-driven referral window. This includes but is not limited to, those students in K-2 who do not participate in MAP and OSAS testing, as well as those in 3-5 for whom computer-based assessments present a roadblock in demonstrating their academic level and need. Families of 2nd grade students who have scored at or above the 95th percentile on the screening assessment for intellectual giftedness (called NNAT) will be notified in January 2025 that their student will be evaluated for TAG identification based on that assessment.

The referral process this year has changed from previous years. Families interested in referring their student for TAG should contact their classroom teacher during this window to discuss their student's needs. Teachers submitting a referral will complete a reflection about their experience with the student in the classroom and consider several things, including:

- How quickly does this student master new concepts and skills?

- Is the student providing insights and thinking about topics in a way that is different from most students?
- In what ways (if any) does the teacher already need to differentiate for this student to support their success?

Once this reflection is completed, additional work samples and assessment data will be collected before the Chief Joseph ES TAG team meets to make a final decision. Once a decision is reached, parents will be informed via email, prior to April 24, 2025.

The TAG website has more information on evaluation and identification, TAG services, and opportunities for parents to provide input and feedback through the TAG Advisory Council (TAGAC).

School Nurse

From our School Nurse: As many of you are aware, we are seeing increased cases of contagious diseases in our area such as Norovirus, RSV (a respiratory virus), and the flu. If your child is sick PLEASE keep them home from school and if they are diagnosed by a doctor, please inform us of their diagnosis.

We just want to remind you that in order to come to school, students must be without a fever for 24 hours without medication (medication masks symptoms but kids are still contagious). They must be without a cough for 24 hours and without vomiting and or diarrhea for 24 hours. Please be diligent and help us protect all of our students!

Counseling Program Update:

At Chief Joseph Elementary, we value cultivating a sense of safety, belonging, and inclusion for every student. As the School Counselor, I support those values through counseling lessons in the classrooms, school-wide programming, restorative justice practices in small group and classroom settings, and through skill-building with students. These values are also represented strongly by our Caring School Community SEL Curriculum, which our students engage in daily.

In January and February, I am delivering classroom lessons focused on Social Justice, including topics such as Diversity, Social Identities, Understanding Race and Racism, How to be a Changemaker, and How to Interrupt Hate Speech. Additionally, I will be working with our GSA student group to deliver school-wide programming that promotes the [ODE Standards for Supporting Gender Expansive Students](#), as well as grade-level standards in the [Learning for](#)

The organizers are looking for 1-2 parents of kinder-4th graders to help out this year so they can carry the tradition on next year and years to come!!

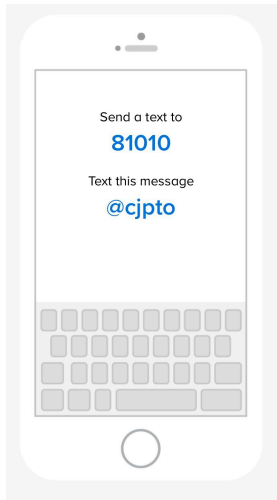
