We are excited to announce a new before and after school care provider. Neighborhood House will begin offering before and after school care on site in the fall. They are also offering a summer program at Sabin, and Chief Joseph families are welcome to attend. Neighborhood

House was selected by a panel of Chief Joseph school staff and parents. #### **PPS Meals for ALL youth in Portland**

If your student is attending hybrid learning, they will be given a free lunch at the end of their school day to take home to eat. If your student is doing distance learning, you can pick up free meals daily at Ockley Green Middle School from 3:30-4:30 at the side doors on Ainsworth Street. No need for student ID numbers. Meals are free for ALL youth ages 1-18 in Portland.

#### Library

This has been a very busy and exciting week as hybrid started! Please know that I have been moved to teaching 5th grade hybrid in the mornings and library in the afternoons and our Library Assistant, Andrea W, has had some schedule changes too; thus there are some important changes in the library schedule. The CJ Library will be open on **Thursdays from 1:00-3:30pm** to exchange library book bags for online (CDL) and hybrid students. Classroom teachers will now be responsible for distributing any classroom materials to students regardless if they are online or in hybrid. As far as chromebooks, I will continue to troubleshoot any issues that I can; however, if you are in need of exchanging chromebooks you will need to do so at the PPS district office (501 N. Dixon St). Please go to the lower level parking lot, which has an entrance on N. Larrabee Ave. Monday through Friday, 9 a.m.-1 p.m. You can find more information at https://www.pps.net/devices.

In the next few weeks, the district library office will be sending out automated emails to students and parents for any books that were checked out last year before the pandemic and that have not been returned yet. I will be placing cardboard boxes labeled *LIBRARY RETURNS* at each entrance to the building so students can drop off returning books in these boxes and we will get them checked in after a quarantine period. Please know that these books are not the same books that are in the library book bags that we have been checking out to students and families this year.

#### **Covid Reporting**

Portland Public Schools is committed to protecting the health and wellbeing of our students, Astaff, and buildings by providing communicable disease prevention and control services through our health partnerships with Multnomah Education Service District (MESD) and Multnomah County Health Department (MCHD). The confidentiality of the individuals reporting is of the utmost importance; personal identifiable information will not be shared with the public or other individuals. We are asking that students who have tested positive for COVID-19, or had close contact exposure with a positive case notify their teacher or Principal Gerber. Close contact exposure includes being less than 6 feet from a person who has COVID-19 for at least 15 cumulative minutes in a day, regardless of whether either person was wearing a mask or other personal protective equipment. Students who are experiencing primary symptoms of Covid-19 but have NOT to their knowledge had close contact exposure with a positive case of Covid-19, and who are not positive cases themselves should also report their symptoms to their teacher or Amber Gerber.

#### **Primary COVID-19 Symptoms:**

- Temperature of 100.4°F or higher
- Cough
- Chills
- Shortness of breath/ Difficulty breathing
- New loss of taste or smell

In both the above cases, Principal Gerber, or the school health nurse, will contact the family following PPS COVID-19 Case Protocol.
