And, there are my serious concerns about the current surge in the ongoing pandemic, and the tremendous responsibility I feel to ensure that our students are safe, and our students and families of color are centered in my decision making. However, if there is anything the last 18 months taught me, it is that with the support of our community, we will get through, and be stronger in the end.

That said, I know many of you have questions about our specific building plans. I will do my best to answer your questions, address plans that are still under development, and ensure you have a sense of where to find answers and direct your questions.

#### **Current Plans:**

- Building Entry: The entry plan will be the same as we used during hybrid.
  - o Kindergarten students will enter through the west doors, near Arbor Lodge Park.
  - Grades 1-2 will enter through the doors near the library, on the north side of the building.
  - Grades 3-4 will enter through the doors near the gym, on the north side of the building.
  - 5th Grade will go directly to the portable. Beginning on the second day of school, they will put their belongings in the classroom and proceed to their specials, which begin at 8:45.
  - We are still encouraging using the drop & go option on Bryant St. for older students. Approach from the west, and pull up to the curb and students can get out and proceed to the building. You won't have to find parking, and it will reduce congestion around the building.
  - Only students will be allowed into the building at arrival.
- Pick-Up: Again, we will be following the plan we used for hybrid.
  - Classrooms with exterior doors will dismiss directly from these doors.
  - Third and fourth grade will dismiss from the gym doors.
  - 5th grade will dismiss from the portables.
- Click here for a map of the building with pick up and drop off locations.
- Lunch: Our fabulous PTO has purchased sitting mats so that when the weather is good, students in grades 3-5 will be able to sit outside for lunch. This will allow for grades K-2 to be completely spread out, with greater than 6ft distance between students. We are also looking into obtaining pop-up canopies to continue this practice when the weather is still warm, but a little drizzly. When the cold/wet weather sets in, we are able to ensure that every student will have at least 5ft distance, and most students will have 6ft distance. Students will have assigned seats, and we will be sanitizing the tables between classes.
- Classrooms have adequate space to ensure 3ft distance between students. Students
  will be required to wear masks while indoors and will be asked to wash and sanitize
  their hands frequently. We are also limiting shared supplies.
- Volunteers: At this time we are limiting volunteers, essential volunteer work must be approved by the administrator. Volunteers will be required to undergo all safety trainings prior to beginning.
- Air Filtration: All spaces are equipped with air filtration devices. You can find more information about these devices on the district's webpage.
