

# Chief Joseph Elementary School Family Bulletin 10.29.2019

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## **All School News**

Portland Public Schools has referred renewal of a levy that currently funds teaching positions across the district for voters' consideration on the November 5, 2019 ballot. Approximately one in three Portland Public Schools teaching positions is funded by the current levy. At Chief Joseph, the levy funded 5 teaching positions in the 2018-19 school year. Over the past five years, the levy funded an average of 825 teaching positions annually throughout the district. If renewed, the levy is estimated to produce \$99.9 million for Portland Public Schools in school year 2020-2021 and would fund teaching positions and classroom supports, such as Special Education services, at every school in the district.

**The proposed levy would not be a new tax.** It would be a renewal of the current levy, first approved by voters in 2011 and renewed in 2014. Currently, homeowners pay \$1.99 per \$1,000 of assessed home value for the levy. If approved by voters, homeowners would continue to pay the same rate for an additional five years.

If passed, this local option would require independent citizen oversight so that tax dollars would be used for purposes approved by local voters. Funds would be placed in a sub-account to facilitate oversight and accurate reporting. No funds from this local option levy would be used for district administration.

If the levy is not approved in 2019, the levy rate would not be renewed and Portland Public Schools would not receive an estimated \$99.9 million in tax revenue in school year 2020-21, which may result in the loss of funding for up to 825 teaching positions. **Ballots are due by Tuesday, November 5 at 8pm.** Visit <u>multco.us/dropsites</u> to find an official drop box. #### **TAG News**

Our school conducted cognitive testing for all second graders on October 28th. In addition, scores from MAP testing in math have come in, and if your child scored between 95th and 99th percentile, your child will qualify for TAG (Talented and Gifted) only once you fill out and return the nomination form to your **child's teacher**. Once the teacher completes the form and returns it to me, I will go ahead and let you know the official designation.

If you would like to nominate your child for TAG in reading, math, or intellectual zones, please contact the classroom teacher first to see if they are seeing behaviors or skills indicative of TAG students. If you then would like to nominate your child, fill in the nomination form and return it to the **classroom teacher**. I will then notify you when TAG testing will occur. It will generally occur between winter and spring.

October has been a whirlwind and I cannot believe that it's almost over! This month *Kinders* have been working on identifying fiction and nonfiction books; *First graders* are working on knowing different parts of a book; *Second graders* are learning how to find books on our online catalog; *Third graders* are looking up books on the online catalog and learning how to find them on the shelves; while *Fourth and Fifth graders* are learning how to access their student drives and create a presentation about

themselves in Google Slides (they can also access their presentations at home if you would like to see what they are working on).

Last year we made just under \$8,000 from the book fair, which earned us \$4,000 in books and materials for our school library! This year our goal is \$10,000 which would give the library \$5,000 to use towards books and materials. My goal this year is to add materials with higher reading levels to our

School attendance is very important. Therefore, this year we are improving our Tier 1 attendance supports by providing consistent attendance data to students and families. Every Monday morning, students will be informed of their grade level's average daily attendance during our Monday morning announcements. This will also be tracked on our attendance bulletin board at the front of the school. Additionally, at the end of the month the grade with the highest average daily attendance will earn an extra recess with me, Ms. Lynn. We hope that this will support our families and students in keeping their attendance up by encouraging those students who may struggle to get up on time or make it to school when they aren't sick.
