Last year we made just under \$8,000 from the book fair, which earned us \$4,000 in books and materials for our school library! This year our goal is \$10,000 which would give the library \$5,000 to use towards books and materials. My goal this year is to add materials with higher reading levels to our collection in order to support our higher grade levels. In order to achieve this

Dear Families,

School attendance is very important. Therefore, this year we are improving our Tier 1 attendance supports by providing consistent attendance data to students and families. Every Monday morning, students will be informed of their grade level's average daily attendance during our Monday morning announcements. This will also be tracked on our attendance bulletin board at the front of the school. Additionally, at the end of the month the grade with the highest average daily attendance will earn an extra recess with me, Ms. Lynn. We hope that this will support our families and students in keeping their attendance up by encouraging those students who may struggle to get up on time or make it to school when they aren't sick.

I will also continue sending home attendance letters at the end of the month to students and families who have accumulated more than 2 missed days each month as a way to inform families how quickly absences add up. Feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns.
