Counseling Corner

Hi Families! We wanted to follow up with you and inform you of our attendance policy updates. We are so happy to have your children here and want to make sure they can attend school as much as possible. Regular on-time attendance helps them be a part of the classroom and see their friends regularly. It increases their ability to be part of specialized educational activities like art, music and reading groups. Learning how to read and write by 3rd grade shows it will have a positive impact on these students as they grow up and into adulthood.

Therefore, if your child misses 2 or more days in a month, you will receive a letter from the school informing you of the amount of days your child has missed. This is because by PPS standards chronic attendance is missing two or more days in a month's time. If your child misses more than 4 days in one month, then we will reach out by phone to connect with you and see if there is anything we can do to support you and your child. After 10 days of consecutive absences without a known reason, your child will be unenrolled and a school meeting is needed to figure out barriers to the lack of attendance.
