-MESSAGES FROM THE PPS DISTRICT OFFICE-

*During the week of March 7 – 16, staff from TNTP, a national education non-profit, will be visiting some of our ELA and math classrooms to see a typical week of school from the perspective of our students. They'll be focusing on the parts of school we know have the biggest impact on our students' futures:

- o What students experience in the classroom during lessons
- o The kinds of work teachers ask students to complete

TNTP will work to better understand this information in coordination with teachers and principals to ensure it doesn't cause any disruptions. Nothing collected will be used to grade or evaluate our school, teachers, or students. The only goal is to better understand the experiences students are having in our school every day, so that we can make that experience as positive and powerful as it can be. Later this spring, TNTP will share back findings from their site visit which will give us new information to continue to improve the ways we work with you and your students to help them reach the big goals we know they have.
