The Lost & Found is overflowing and will be donated to the PPS Clothing Closet during winter break. Ask your child to check the Lost & Found or you can stop by and check at drop off or pick up. Everything left after Friday, Dec. 20 will be donated.

We have a new volunteer/visitor check in system at the **school.** Please bring a government issued ID with you if you are entering the school beyond the front office. All visitors/volunteers will need to wear the printed name badge that identifies their name, the date and their destination. If you are undocumented or do not have a government-issued ID, bring the official records that you have (i.e. birth certificate, foreign passport, etc.) and school administrators will evaluate and make determinations. Our database is for PPS district use only; information is not shared with any outside agency. Approved volunteers who have cleared a Volunteer Background Check will already have their names in the system; however, they will still need to provide their ID upon their first visit. Upon future visits, they will be able to use their name to pull up their record and sign in. Approved volunteers may chaperone and work with students in our schools, whereas, visitors are only allowed restricted access and for shorter lengths of time. New volunteers (or those with expired background checks; they expire every 3 years) should visit www.pps.net/volunteer to complete the online volunteer application. Thank you, in advance, for your understanding and patience.

#### **Playground News**

Have you ever thought our exposed, asphalt-covered playground at CJES could offer more to our kids? A small group of interested parents have started to organize around this idea. We're currently working to move forward a tree planting project that was approved by the school district last year. The tree

planting project would add four trees to the playground for much needed shade. Ideally, a bench would surround each tree for protection and to provide playground seating. We're partnering with <a href="Depave">Depave</a>, a nonprofit organization that promotes community-based pavement removal projects, and the City of Portland's Bureau of Environmental Services <a href="Tree Program">Tree Program</a>, which will donate, plant, and maintain the trees for five years. There are still details to work out, but asphalt removal and tree planting are currently estimated to occur in Fall 2020. Our goal is for this tree planting project to be the first part of a multi-phased effort to create varied and healthy play spaces at the playground.
