Free Meals for Chief Joseph School Students!

Where: Meals will be available for pickup outside Chief Joseph School.

When: Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, 3 to 5 p.m.

Details: Students will receive seven days' worth of meals **free** each week outside of Chief Joseph School, regardless of income qualifications. On Monday, they will get breakfast and lunch for Tuesday and Wednesday; on Wednesday, they will get meals for Thursday and Friday and on Fridays, they will get meals for Saturday, Sunday and Monday. Chief Joseph School is a Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) School this year, so meals are for ALL students at NO CHARGE as long as they are enrolled at our school. Families who need assistance accessing meals can request home delivery <u>here</u> on the right hand side of the page under Meal Delivery.

Counseling Corner

Dear Families,

First, I want to take a moment and acknowledge the wildfires and send my love and support to all those who are being impacted. Here are some tips around supporting children during times of crisis that I wanted to share with you all. *tips taken from ASCA website

- Try and keep routines as normal as possible. Kids gain security from the predictability of routine, including attending school.
- Limit exposure to television and the news.
- Be honest with kids and share with them as much information as they are developmentally able to handle.
- Listen to kids' fears and concerns.
- Reassure kids that the world is a good place to be, but that there are people who do bad things.
- Parents and adults need to first deal with and assess their own responses to crisis and stress.
- Rebuild and reaffirm attachments and relationships.

Student Health Centers

This fall, while schools are engaged in Comprehensive Distance Learning, PPS Roosevelt Student Health Center will be open starting Monday, September 14th for phone, video and in-person visits. Monday-Thursday 8:45 am-4:45 pm and Friday for phone and video appointments only. Call 503-988-3909 to make an appointment.

Any Multnomah County K-12 youth can visit the center and there are no out of pocket costs. We also can connect students and their families with community resources for food or help with medical insurance.

Rent

- <u>Eviction Moratorium Information</u>
 - A statewide eviction moratorium is in effect until Sept. 30, 2020.

- That means **you cannot be evicted for non-payment** between April 1 and Sept. 30, 2020.
- You will have until March 31, 2021, to pay back any rent owed from these months. However, once the moratorium expires on Sept. 30, 2020, renters will be required to pay rent on a regular basis again. So you will need to make rent in October, and in subsequent months, on time or your landlord could issue a 72-hour notice for non-payment of rent and initiate eviction proceedings.
- <u>Multnomah County COVID-19 Rent Relief Fund Program</u>
 - Find all information regarding this assistance <u>here</u>.
 - If COVID-19 has impacted your ability to pay rent, you may qualify for the Multhomah County COVID-19 Rent Relief Fund Program. In order to see if you qualify you will need to call 211, confirm eligibility, and get added to the waitlist.
 - The waitlist opens periodically, so call 211 often to check status!
