Dear Families,

I am really looking forward to seeing everybody at the PTO meeting this Wednesday! Our Parent Teacher Organization is very dedicated to supporting the success of all our students. PTO is a great way to be connected to the school community.

Many of you have asked how our staffing numbers are determined, and what decisions are made at the building level. This year we received direct allocation from the district for the number of classroom teachers at each grade level. Additionally, the office staff, counselor, Special Education staff, PE, library, and arts are funded directly by the district. At the building level, I made decisions about how to use district Equity funds and Foundation funds awarded by All Hands Raised. These additional funds have been used for two ¹/₂ time educational assistants. The assistants support our 1st/2nd grade blended classroom, kindergarten Early Reading Intervention, and 3rd grade literacy. These grades and classes were prioritized because of class sizes and/or the important reading milestones at the grade level. I also chose to create a School Climate Specialist position. Ms. Whitaker works with teachers and students to strengthen our climate at ensure our school is a place students want to be. The final decision made at the building level was to increase the school secretary to full time. In addition to manning the office, Ms. Holme is working with Ms. Spiers on our attendance initiatives. I hope this provides some clarity.

On Friday, Ms. Whitaker and Ms. Spiers sent out letters to students who signed up for Jr. Coaches or Leadership. These groups had their first meeting on Monday. Safety Patrol will be meeting soon. I am really excited to see students stepping up to take on these positions of responsibility. If your 4th or 5th grade student is still A strong, diverse and respectful community where we make learning creative and fun!

No School Monday, 10/29 Hello and welcome back to another great year! This year has been off to a great start! I wanted to continue that momentum and take a second to remind our families about the importance of attendance. Did you know:

- Students who miss 10% of the school year (or 17 days throughout the year) are considered chronically absent
- This number includes excused AND unexcused absences
- Missing 10% or more of the school year can make it harder to learn to read
- Attendance is one of the three school success indicators reflected in our school's report card issued yearly by the state
- When students reduce absences, they can make great academic gains

Last year, 15.5% of Chief Joseph students were chronically absent. We are working to decrease that number this year and in the years to come by providing outreach, school wide attendance awareness, and resources to students and families.

If you have any questions about your child's attendance or if you need resources for your family to help support school attendance, don't hesitate to call the main office or me, Lynn Spiers, our school counselor at 503 -916- 6234!

Music News

Welcome to Music Class in room 10. Being in the building will make transitions easier, and the space is bigger. Come on by and take a look!

Kindergarten and Grade 1 students will be spending much of the year solidifying steady beat and elemental rhythms. They will work on matching pitch. They will play mostly rhythm instruments, and do movement and games that teach improvisational thinking and conducting.

Grades 2-3 will be learning to read musical notation, starting with rhythmic and moving to notes on the staff. They will be using the barred percussion instruments and non-pitched instruments. They will be learning about singing in tune with a natural, beautiful tone.

This year, grades 4-5 will be doing a new curriculum through Carnegie Hall, that culminates in an interactive concert with the Oregon Symphony in the spring. It is called "The Orchestra Swings", and involves singing, choreography and recorder playing with the orchestra.

Students will be using "bucket seats" to facilitate better posture and easier use of instruments. They are a little rough to sit on for long periods of time, so here's where you can help. Cushions will be sewn to make them more comfortable. If you would like to donate a "fat square" or 1/4 yard of cotton fabric that has images representing your family culture, please drop it by the office by September 14, 2018.

If you have a musical artifact that you are willing to loan to display for a week or two, please contact me to schedule it. A

demonstration would be very interesting for our students.

Look for a survey to be sent home about what your family's musical participation is. You can share musical information about your student and family. This will also give you a chance to communicate your interest and special skills for volunteering in the music classroom.

Also coming soon is a special opportunity for Grade 5 students. Oregon Music Educators Association (OMEA) All-State Conference will be in Portland this year. I will be auditioning grade 5 students who are interested for the Elementary Honor Choir. This must be done before the end of September. Be sure to let me know if your child is interested. Later in the year there will be another opportunity for 5th graders with the PPS Elementary Honor Choir. This is going to be a busy year with our two evening performance events, "The Orchestra Swings", All-State and "The Heart Of Portland" Elementary Honor Choir.
