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Dear Families,

Today we practiced our Reunification Drill. Thank you to the families that were able to participate. The purpose of the drill was to practice safely and effectively reuniting students with families, or emergency pick up persons. We would implement the reunification process in the case of a major emergency, such as a school fire or earthquake. We learned a lot during this drill. Many of our takeaways are internal, such as how to better utilize staff and resources like walkie-talkies. We also learned areas we are going to need support, and needed improvements around helping families with the initial steps of the process. If you participated in the drill, we would love your feedback. Please don't hesitate to email me your ideas. Our safety committee will be communicating improvements to the process, so stay tuned.

This is also a good time to remind families of the importance of updating your emergency contact list. We can not release a student to a person who is not listed on your student's emergency contact. See Janna in the main office to make these updates. Please communicate your emergency plan with your students. Additionally, in the case that we need to evacuate our school grounds, Peace Lutheran Church, located on the corner of Rosa Parks Ave. and Newcastle St. is our secondary evacuation site.

Since we are on the topic of student safety, I also want to address the importance of driving slowly and carefully at pick up and drop off. We have received complaints about cars not stopping or slowing down near the front entrance of school. It was reported that two students were nearly hit. Please drive carefully.

TAG News

TAG (Talented And Gifted) is used when referring to a student who is identified as Talented and Gifted though pre-established identification procedures and criteria. Portland Public School's goal is for all students to have equal access to a rich learning environment and their individual needs met by creating opportunities based on principles of equity and the Successful Schools Framework.

TAG is defined as a group of students who demonstrate an advanced or even exceptional ability in a particular area, and score between the 95th and 99th percentile. Through the use of an assessment tool and process, PPS may identify students who have potential to perform at high levels either in talent or giftedness. This definition of potential includes the intentional and substantive development of our students so their talents and gifts can be recognized, supported and nurtured.

If you believe your child may have skills/abilities in the Talented and Gifted (TAG) range, there is a process by which you may nominate your child for evaluation for this eligibility. To nominate your child, you must turn in your application for the evaluation to Rose Michels, Building TAG Facilitator, by November 30th. The form is available on the TAG bulletin board in the hallway across from the staff lounge or on the TAG website: <u>http://www.pps.net/tag</u> Please fill out the parent portion and give the form to your child's teacher to complete. Then, place the form in my mailbox or give it directly to me.

Students in grades 3-5 cannot be nominated for reading or math as they will be using the statewide SBAC test scores to determine eligibility. If your child scores between 95-99 percentiles, you will be notified and asked if you would like to nominate your child for TAG at that point. This will be closer to the end of the year, after testing has occurred.

Also, every 2nd grader will be given the TAG Cogat screening test on October 17th. This will determine eligibility in the TAG program based on cognitive ability.
