- All PPS students have a PPS account, which allows them access to many district resources. The username is generally their first initial, last name, and the last 4 digits of their pupil ID.

For example, if my pupil ID was 123456 and my name is Amber Gerber, my PPS username will likely be: agerber3456.

You can get help with resetting the password through the IT department. Click here to reset your password. Students in grades 3-5 likely know their username and password. However, students in grades K-3 usually log on with clever badges and may require more support.
