As we approach September 2nd, I know many of you are anxious to know what the school day will look like for your students. Between September 2nd and the 11th, we will be following the <u>Soft Start Guidelines</u>, provided by the district.

Beginning September 2nd, all students grades 1-5 will start their day at 9:00 am, with a synchronous Google Meeting. Click here for directions to join a Google Meet. This will be a 30 minute session focused on getting to know each other and building classroom community. Teachers will be sending you the code to join your student's class meeting Friday afternoon. If you would like an opportunity to practice joining a Google Meet prior to Wednesday, use the code WeloveCJ at any of the following times:

As a reminder, make sure you are using Chrome as your web browser, and your student is logged into their PPS account. You can find <u>directions for logging into Chrome here</u>. If you need support with technology, you can contact the district IT department by calling Call 503-916-3375 or emailing support@pps.net.

During the Soft Start, you can expect your student to practice the different learning applications, such as SeeSaw. However, the focus will be on teacher professional development and planning, and building a classroom community.

Kindergarten families can expect a 30 minute check in with their teacher beginning of September 1st,

and will begin class meetings on September 8th.

Beginning September 14th, comprehensive distant learning, and rigorous academic content will begin in earnest. At this time, the instructional schedule is still being negotiated between PPS and Portland Association of Teachers. I know you are anxious to have this information to plan, so I want to give you as much information as I can. Please know that details may change based on the outcome of negotiations this Friday. For now, I believe, all classes will begin at 9:00 am, with a synchronous class meeting. From there, students will engage in a combination of short whole group mini lessons, followed by periods of asynchronous learning, small group instruction, and movement breaks. Students will be scheduled for one synchronous session of art, PE, and music per week. Lunch for all students will be from 12:00-12:45. The student day will end at 3:00. However, expect a lot of movement breaks and student-led activities during the day. Teachers will be reaching out with details when the schedule is finalized, most likely the week of September 8th.

PPS Nutrition Services have made changes to their food distribution for the fall. Beginning Wednesday, September 2 students and families can pick up breakfast and lunch items only on Mondays and Wednesdays from 3pm-5pm at designated school sites. Chief Joseph Elementary will be a food site location this fall. You can see the complete list of school sites here.

Rent

• Eviction Moratorium Information

- o A statewide eviction moratorium is in effect until Sept. 30, 2020.
- That means you cannot be evicted for non-payment between April 1 and Sept. 30, 2020.
- You will have until March 31, 2021, to pay back any rent owed from these months.
 However, once the moratorium expires on Sept. 30, 2020, renters will be required to pay rent on a regular basis again. So you will need to make rent in October, and in subsequent months, on time or your landlord could issue a 72-hour notice for non-payment of rent and initiate eviction proceedings.

• Multnomah County COVID-19 Rent Relief Fund Program

- Find all information regarding this assistance here.
- If COVID-19 has impacted your ability to pay rent, you may qualify for the Multnomah
 County COVID-19 Rent Relief Fund Program. In order to see if you qualify you will need to call 211, confirm eligibility, and get added to the waitlist.
- The waitlist opens periodically, so call 211 often to check status!
