# **Counseling Corner**

#### Dear Families,

I am continuing to join classroom morning meetings in order to teach a racial equity/social justice unit. So far we have discussed our identities, cultures and what makes us special and unique. This month we will be discussing diversity and celebrating our similarities and differences. We will also be reading the book <u>All the Colors We Are</u> by Katie Kissinger. This book teaches us where our skin color comes from and is preparing us for the lesson in March about race. If you haven't already done so, I suggest checking in with your student and asking them about the lessons. I know some students struggled to identify and think about their culture. Therefore, I encourage families to discuss their culture at home with their children. We defined culture as patterns of behavior shared by a group of people including language, food, traditions, religions, customs, and beliefs. I hope this leads to rich conversations about your family's culture!

Additionally, Jane Strugatsky, School Social Worker, and I have started a parenting group to build community and provide a safe, supportive space for us to discuss distance learning and working while parenting. We hope to build a supportive community with one another and provide a space for us to fight the isolation that has occurred due to the pandemic. Our next meetings will be February 8th and 22nd from 4:30-5:30pm and will continue every other Monday. ## **School Exclusion Day**

On February 17, children who are not up to date on vaccinations will be unable to attend in-person school or child care. If your child is missing vaccines, it's time to catch up!

To avoid missing school or child care, get your child up to date on their vaccinations as soon as possible. Click <u>here</u> to view school immunization requirements for the State of Oregon. Vaccines keep your child healthy and protected from serious diseases. During Covid-19, it's still important that your child's vaccination schedule stay on track. Clinics and doctor's offices are taking extra steps to make sure that visits happen safely during Covid-19. If your child

doesn't have a regular health care provider or if you can't get an appointment, you can get them vaccinated at one of MESD's clinics:

# Vaccine Catch-up Day - Saturday, February 13, 10am-3pm

Student Health Centers

- All children ages 5-18 can get vaccinations for no out-of-pocket cost at one of 4 locations
- We're located at local high schools, but you don't need to attend school there to get care
- We accept all types of insurance and serve the uninsured

Primary Care Clinics

- Low or no-cost vaccinations for children, including uninsured
- Call 503-988-5558 to make a new patient appointment

If you received a letter from school or the Health Department, bring it with you when you take your child to be vaccinated.Immunizations are one of the best ways to prevent diseases and keep everyone healthy. We hope your child never has to stay home from school or child care.

# **Covid Reporting**

Portland Public Schools is committed to protecting the health and wellbeing of our students, staff, and buildings by providing communicable disease prevention and control services through our health partnerships with Multnomah Education Service District (MESD) and Multnomah County Health Department (MCHD). The confidentiality of the individuals reporting is of the utmost importance; personal identifiable information will not be shared with the public or other individuals.

We are asking that students who have tested positive for COVID-19, or had close contact exposure with a positive case notify their teacher or Principal Gerber. Close contact exposure includes being less than 6 feet from a person who has COVID-19 for at least 15 cumulative minutes in a day, regardless of whether either person was wearing a mask or other personal protective equipment.

Students who are experiencing primary symptoms of Covid-19 but have NOT to their knowledge had close contact exposure with a positive case of Covid-19, and who are not positive cases themselves should also report their symptoms to their teacher or Amber Gerber.

## Primary COVID-19 Symptoms:

- Temperature of 100.4°F or higher
- Cough
- Chills
- Shortness of breath/ Difficulty breathing
- New loss of taste or smell

In both the above cases, Principal Gerber, or the school health nurse, will contact the family following PPS COVID-19 Case Protocol.
