PTO's 2nd Annual Spring Fest:


Spring Fest is happening in the evening this Friday from 6:00 to 8:00pm. We will have a food truck with food available for purchase.

Student Classroom Placement and Information for 2023-24 school year:

We will notify you of your students' classroom placement mid-August by mail. Placing students in classrooms is thoughtfully done each year and we believe that children benefit from learning

in a classroom that is representative of the greater community in which they live. For this reason, class assignments consider many factors, maximizing the intellectual, emotional, and social development of each child. Each new school year gives your student an opportunity to develop new friends and an opportunity to work with new classmates. This is a life-long skill that is necessary for joining new groups, clubs, and teams, as well as success in middle school, high school, and beyond. School staff put a great deal of effort and energy into smoothing the transition between grade levels. Current teachers assist with the process by providing information about each child's skill levels, behavior, leadership skills, and special needs. The lists are then balanced for gender, diversity, achievement levels, leadership qualities, behavior, and special needs. Our objective is to find the best match, so all children meet both academic and social goals.

Oregon Health Plan (OHP) - Important

If you or your student have Oregon Health Plan (OHP), you have to update your contact information.

Starting April 1st, [Oregon Health Authority \(OHA\) started reviewing and determining member eligibility for OHP.](#) OHP coverage renewed automatically during the last three years, but automatic renewal ended in March. Most people will continue to qualify, but OHA has to review qualification for all OHP members by mid-2024. Oregon has taken steps to keep as many people as possible covered with medical insurance during this change.

To make sure your family keeps access to care, including counseling & chemical dependency treatment, make sure your contact information is up-to-date and review any emails or mail you receive which will tell you what you need to do to keep benefits. The fastest way OHP members update their information is by going to benefits.oregon.gov and logging into their

ONE account. Other options for updating contact information also can be found on the web [here](#). You can call 1-800-699-9075 or 711 for help with OHP.

If someone does not meet the requirements, their OHP benefits will continue for another 60 days. OHA will [help members](#) change to other coverage by providing information. This may include information about financial help available for other health plans.

Students can continue to obtain no-cost healthcare at [Student Health Centers](#) and the OHSU-sponsored [Benson Wellness Center](#), regardless of insurance status.
