Counseling Corner

Dear Families,

School attendance is very important. Did you know that students with good attendance are **4 times** more likely to graduate high school than those who are chronically absent?

Here at Chief Joseph Elementary last year, 84.5% of our students had good or acceptable attendance but 15.5% of our students were chronically absent. Chronically absent means missing more than 2 days per month.

This year, please help us provide the best possible education to your child by sending your child to school every day, on time. If you have any questions or concerns about your child's attendance, please let us know. We are here to support your family.

What you can do to support your child's attendance:

- Set a regular bedtime and morning routine.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before
- Don't let your child stay home unless she is truly sick. Keep in mind complaints of a

- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors, or other parents for advice on how to make her feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor, or another parent.
- Avoid medical appointments and extended trips when school is in session.
- Contact school staff or community partners to find resources around transportation, housing, employment, or health care.

SBAC postcards were mailed today to parents of children who scored 95% or higher on last Spring's SBAC. In order not to confuse parents you will receive a separate postcard for SBAC Reading and/ or SBAC Math. Some families may actually receive 2 postcards if your child met that standard in both. Remember if they fall into the range of potentially gifted (95%-96%) or gifted (97%-99%) you must still fill out a nomination form and return it to Ms. Michels to have your child in the Talented and Gifted program..
