



Wilson Summer Reading Assignment 2018/19

English 1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 7-8 and Creative Writing

1. Read what you can, when you can. Select books, short stories, magazines, news articles, essays, comics, blogs, reviews, graphic novels, etc.
2. Two ways to record your reading:
 - a. Go Green, Wilson! Sign up on the mobile site starting June 1 which can be found at <https://multcolib.org/summer-reading> to keep track of your progress;
 - b. Or use the paper Multco Library game card to track progress (available from your current English teacher OR at your nearest Multco Library).
3. In addition to reading, you may also complete the digital or cultural activities suggested on the summer reading program game board and/or website.
4. Throughout the summer, record your reading and activities. *See the italicized instructions copied from the website on the back of this page, or just go to the site.*
5. Bring your signed (parent/guardian AND student) game boards (up to three) or signed printout of online game badges to the first day of English class.
6. On top of the Multco Library prizes available on site at libraries throughout the summer, all Wilson students who participate will win a frozen treat AND be entered into a raffle for a \$100 gift card from Powell's and other prizes!

NOTE: Although this is not a graded assignment, your summer reading choices will probably reflect your interests, likes and dislikes. What you choose to read says something about you as a person, and so whether you are preparing to enter high school for the first time, looking forward to getting a part in the fall play, joining the pep band, working hard to earn a starting spot on a sports team, or dreading the toil of college application season, you might find that what you read this summer somehow impacts how you begin the 2018/19 school year. Why not get off to a great start?

Free fun and prizes at the library this summer! Babies, kids and teens can play the Summer Reading game by starting a daily reading habit. Libraries will have free live performances, arts and crafts, and more in addition to the Summer Reading game. It all kicks off June 15. Libraries rock!

How to play (teens entering grades 9-12)

- 1. Starting June 1, sign up online (it's free) to track your reading on the mobile site. Or, starting June 15, come in to any Multnomah County library to get a game board (also free).*
- 2. If you play online, enter every day you read about an hour. On the gameboard, mark a space every time you read for an hour or do any of the challenge activities.*
- 3. If you play online, the site will let you know when you earn your prizes. When you've filled your first card, you can bring it to the library on or after June 29 to choose a coupon or entry in a drawing. Do the same with card 2 (prizes available starting July 14) and card 3 (prizes available starting July 29).*
- 4. When you have filled all three cards, you've completed the challenge! You'll get a prize, a T-shirt (while supplies last), coupons for Oaks Park, Oregon Ballet Theatre and Oregon Children's Theatre, and an entry in the Grand Prize drawing! Claim your prizes by August 31, 2018.*
