- What are some things you want to see in the school?

- My fifth grader also has test anxiety. The state testing causes more anxiety.
- What kind of prep do kids get? Do they get informed about the why? Do they get into a good headspace?
- This culture setting needs to be set.
- Is there a practice test?
  - Yes, they do. I'm not sure every grade does that.
- It would be nice to get an exact test.
- Maybe it's the timing – can we do it partially.
- But we need engagement and excitement.
- Ricardo Barber – so we need to set goals that brings part of these standardized tests into the curriculum.
- We need to take similar tests multiple times.
- There is taking the test but then also some big academic gaps.
- Get everyone doing tests all the time – so get that problem out of there – then identify the skill gaps.
- Is the MAP test more accurate of the class report? It can be confusing to parents.
- Different teachers explain MAP differently – the teachers aren't aligned on what the tests mean.
- The data is used for intervention.
- We have another MAP coming up in January – how do we communicate it. Newsletter?
- It would be helpful to know and reinforce. Have it so where the testing environment is more comfortable.
