



Student Success Center

Student Success Center (SSC) is a program to assist students in addressing behaviors and attitudes that are getting in the way of school success. SSC provides up to 6 months of support, with a 3-week intensive behavioral skill intervention, which includes:

- Skill instruction in the areas of:
 - Anger Management
 - Conflict Resolution
 - Healthy Choices
 - Alcohol or Other Drug Resistance
 - Mental Health and/or Alcohol or Other Drug evaluations by community-based providers (current evaluation information is required as part of program participation)
 - Development of a Student Success Plan, which includes recommendations from assessments
 - Collaboration with family and community partners

After the 3-week program, the SSC staff continues to provide support for up to 6 months.

Continued support includes:

- Review of behavioral skills
- Collaboration with family and community partners
- Coordination with counselors, teachers and administrators
- Review and revisions of Student Success Plan with school, family and students
- Collaboration with mental health and alcohol or other drug treatment providers

- School visits by program staff

SSC provides intensive wraparound services at a level that is greater than schools can offer. Generally, other school-based interventions have been unsuccessful prior to considering a referral to SSC. Students and their families must choose to enter this program and agree to participate fully in order to be enrolled.

How does a student get referred to Student Success Center (SSC)?

After meeting with the student and family to discuss the SSC program, the school counselor or administrator calls Student Success Center and consults about the appropriateness of referral. Students who are appropriate for referral:

- Are not being successful academically and/or behaviorally in school
- Have failed to be successful following other school-based interventions
- Have agreed to participate fully in the SSC program and Student Success Plan
- May have been referred as an appropriate alternative to expulsion (including Level B alcohol or other drug violations)

If the above criteria are met and the student, family, school team, and SSC program staff determined that SSC is appropriate, the counselor or administrator completes then scans an [SSC Referral Form](#) to lweather@pps.net.

When Do Students Start SCC?

After SCC staff receives the program referral, parent/guardian and student will be contacted and asked to come to the SSC building for a family intake interview. After this meeting, SSC begins new students on Mondays as space permits. SSC starts a new 3-week cycle every Monday.

What do Students do at SCC?

During their three weeks attending the skills component, the SCC team works with students to:

- Create a Student Success Plan that addresses their academic, personal-social, and career development; help them acquire skills for anger management, drug and alcohol refusal, and conflict resolution
- Participate in mental health and/or drug and alcohol assessments by community partners;
- Access drug and alcohol treatment or mental health services as needed
- Identify their strengths and participate in activities that build on these strengths
- Identify needs and find helpful school and community resources to meet these needs
- Assist in locating an appropriate community-based option for students who need an alternative educational setting to be more successful in working towards graduation
- Monitor follow-through with their Student Success Plan

Commonly Asked Questions

How long is the Program?

Students attend the SSC program for 3 weeks, Monday through Friday from 8:30am-12:30pm. Student support continues for a semester or more.

Is food and transportation provided?

A small breakfast is provided for all students. Lunch is not served. Students that do not have bus passes will be given bus tickets daily. Parents/guardians may also transport their child.

What about my student's academics?

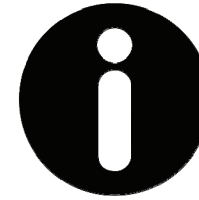
Ideally, students are allowed to attend afternoon classes at their home school and are responsible to keep up with their homework from their morning classes. If the student is not allowed to return back on campus, homework should be collected by parents or guardians. High school students can also earn 0.5 Health or Elective credit if they successfully complete the SSC program.

What about Special Education Students?

If your student is on an IEP, counselors at SSC will coordinate with the school in order to ensure IEP goals are met.

What about ELL?

SSC works with Interpretation Services to provide culturally appropriate services as need to ELL students and their families.
