 - Celebrations: campus beautification, staff and student strong start

 - Review of <u>School Continuious Imporvement Plan (SCIP)</u>

 - PLCs using structured cycle for analysis, reflection, modification of instruction. Only MS that is allowing teachers to meet during the school day during a common planning time trade-off is that teachers have slightly larger class sizes; 6 lead teachers specially trained by Kristina; formally meet 2xweek
 - What do we want each student to learn?

 - Will need to be sure that there is ability to distribute labor of council (i.e. note-taking and posting, etc)
 - teachers will figure it out and update Kelly/Kristina so that agendas/notes can be shared accordingly

 - Professional Growth
 - Possible Actions from year-end report
 - Spring 2019 staff survey results expressed dissatisfaction with use of staff meeting time.
 - New schedule will allow for daily PLCs as well as instructional coaches in both Math and ELA.
 - Behavioral data suggest a continued need for classroom management and racial equity PD
 - Potential for SC-organized, PTA-funded book for every staff
 - <u>GOAL:</u> 80% of staff feel supported by the administration in their professional development related to classroom instruction

(including PLCs, coaching, and feedback) as measured by year-end staff survey

Instruction

- Possible Actions from year-end report
 - Increase the percentage of students meeting MAP growth goal to 60%
 - Explore additional instructional support models for students who are farthest behind in light of potential future cuts to FTE
 - See possible actions for professional development, above
- GOAL: By the end of the school year, 60% or more of students will meet or exceed their individual growth goal in MAP Math
- GOAL: By the end of the school year, 60% or more of students will meet or exceed their individual growth goal in MAP Reading

Discipline

- Possible Actions from year-end report
 - Professional development in the area of classroom management, particularly related to relationship-building and culturally responsive practices
 - Implementation/expansion of peer mediation program
 - Continued modification and fine-tuning of school-wide MTSS practices
 - Continued monitoring of, exploration of, and focus on changing racial discrepancy with the goal of achieving proportionality
