This week marks the end of the first quarter. I cannot believe it. Thank you to all of you who came to the Principal's Chat and Mural Night yesterday. A huge thank you to Mrs. Earle and Shannon Garcia Shinn for working with the 6th graders and organizing the event.

This week the 4/5 grade level team worked together in a Professional Learning Team and looked at student achievement data, interventions for students and worked on PYP year-long plans. It was awesome to collaborate, examine our data, and come up with plans to provide targeted interventions for our students who have instructional, social/emotional and attendance needs by utilizing all of our staff including Mrs. Gervais, our counselor and Mrs. Hiser, our intervention specialist/media specialist. The data showed there is a correlation with attendance and achievement data.

In our data meetings, we identified how we will differentiate our instruction to meet the needs of all learners while implementing our interventions. It is our goal to see our SBAC scores and overall student achievement increase. I have very high hopes for our amazing staff, students and families.

If you are interested in attending an informational meeting on understanding the Skyline School Report Card, the work I am leading with staff and anything else you might want to know, I will be hosting two Parent Information Sessions during conferences on Wednesday, November 8 from 1:00p.m.-2:00-p.m. and 6:00p.m.-7:00p.m. in the library. If we need to schedule a third meeting to accommodate families, please let me know. You are also welcome to pop in my office anytime. I covered a lot of this information at the last PTA meeting but want to make sure everyone hears what we are doing and the new work we have added to our plates. If I am not available, Chris can schedule a time for us to meet. I want to be very transparent with the work we are doing here at Skyline with all of you.

Skyline Eagles Marathon Running Club

I am proud to announce that this year we have a total of 71 runners! Thank you to all the students who are heading to our track and pushing themselves to be physically active and complete more laps every day during recess and on Thursdays before and after school. As of now, our club has run a combined total of 221 miles! Our top runners are Jordan Goettler with 18 miles, Keaton Rader with 14 miles and Henry Whitworth with 13 miles.

Unfortunately, this year our club does not benefit from a grant covering the cost for the prizes. Currently, out of our 71 runners only 15 have paid the \$15 registration fee and the additional \$1 shipping fee. After communicating with a Nike representative, they are willing to offer us a 2 for 1 - or - 50% off the registration fee which brings the price down to \$7.50/per participant.

This means, that 30 runners out of 71 could be registered and receive the prizes. I would love for us to come together as a community and find a way to ensure that all of our runners can be registered and receive prizes for their hard work. The representative also explained that we should act soon as their inventory is diminishing quickly. 

for parents/guardians and teachers to share information, solve problems and form relationships that will help

and form relationships that will help students succeed.

You know more about your student than anyone at school. Your student's teacher (or teachers) needs to hear from you. And you need to hear from the teacher(s). Talking with the teacher about your student will help pave the way for your student to do

well in class and will help you understand what is being taught in the classroom. Classroom conferences are usually 15 to 30 minutes. Conferences for students taking multiple classes (at the high school level, where they may be in the gym or cafeteria) may be shorter. They often are the beginning of an ongoing conversation about your student. If you run out of time, you can always request and schedule a follow-up meeting.

Before the conference

- ▶ Talk with your student to understand his or her questions and concerns about school.
- Check progress reports, report cards and work your student has brought home.
- Think of questions you want to ask the teacher. (See the checklist for possible questions, and add your own.)
- Write down information about your student that the teacher should know, such as a family death, divorce, changed finances, illness or a new home. (You can use the checklist below.)
- All adults with a role in a student's education mother, father, grandparent, guardian
 — are encouraged to attend the conference.
- If English is not your first language, have someone contact the school before the parent teacher conference and request an interpreter to assist you during the meeting.
- If you can't make the scheduled appointment, arrange another time with your student teacher.

At the conference

- Ask the teacher what your student should know by the end of the school year.
- Ask how you can support your student's learning at home.
- If you don't understand something, ask the teacher to explain.
- Find out the best way (notes, phone calls, e-mail) and the best time to communicate with the teacher. (Middle and high school families now can communicate through the EdBox Viewer — ask a teacher if you need information.) Exchange contact information with the teacher.
- Be aware that the teacher needs to talk to other families. Ask to schedule a follow-up meeting, if necessary.

After the conference

- ▶ Jot down a couple of notes about the conference. (The checklist includes space for notes.)
- Discuss with your student what the teacher told you, especially the positive comments.
 Talk about goals and make a plan to reach them together.
- If you are the parent of a young student, check your student's backpack daily for materials sent home from school. Read all of it. If English is not your first language, ask a relative or friend to read the school information to you in your language.
- Contact the teacher whenever you have questions. If your student is not doing well, set up a regular schedule with the teacher to monitor progress. If English is not your first language, get a friend to help you contact the teacher or to ask the school office for an interpreter.
- Send the teacher a thank-you note when something good happens in the classroom
- ▶ Talk with your student every day about school. Attend school events and offer to help from home, volunteer in the classroom or join the parent organization.
