Congratulations to Skyline students Riley Horan, Will McClure, Dylan Kantrowitz, and Quinn Hoop, along with their dedicated coaches/parents, Richard Kantrowitz and Kate Horan, for a great effort at the LEGO robotics state championship this past month focused on the challenges associated with water - how we find, transport, use, or dispose water. Their team, H2brOs, won the Google Innovative Solution Award, recognizing a team's solution that is exceptionally well considered and creative, with good potential to solve the problem they reached.

Their project designed a water conservation education tool incorporating a mini-turbine within a pipe connected to an Arduino mini-computer that would send wifi signals to a smartphone app allowing you to monitor water usage for specific faucets - bath, kitchen sink, washing machine, etc. - and encourage behavior change to reduce wasting water.

Congrats to these Skyline/Portland Public Schools dreamers and makers coming up with ideas to make our world a better place!
