Principal's Message

Welcome to October! From the look of the neighborhood trees, we are in for another glorious fall. I hope everyone had an opportunity to sign up for fall conferences to be held in November this year. I encourage every family to try and make one of the dedicated time slots November 9th or 10th. Your conference time serves as your opportunity to gain feedback on your child's progress. There will be no paper report card for the first quarter of school which ends on November 3rd. Your first paper report card will arrive home with your child after the second quarter in February.

The staff had its first late opening professional development a couple of weeks ago. This time is dedicated to looking at issues of racial equity in Portland and at our school, and developing ourselves as culturally responsive educators. Chapman, along with many other schools in the district, is engaging in a process known as CARE (Collaborative Action Research for Equity). Together we discussed the importance of learning about the different cultures of our students and how our own culture shapes our expectations of students. Counselor's Corner

I am always on a quest for positive ways to talk to kids, especially when providing discipline or redirection. Below is sample conversation that I came across. It provides a 6 step process with examples for correcting children's behaviors. Clearly state your feelings – "I am upset that the toolbox was left outside in the rain."

State the expectation – "I expect my tools to be returned when you've borrowed them."

Show your child how to fix it – "What the toolbox needs right now is to be cleaned up."

Give a choice – "You can choose to borrow and return my tools or you can choose not to borrow them again. You decide."

When incidents occur they also provide an opportunity to engage in problem solving. Discuss with your child what should be different next time. For example, "What is a way that you can use my tools that would work for both of us?"

- 2016-2017 Free/Reduced Lunch Application Students who were receiving free or reduced-price meal benefits at the end of last year must fill out a NEW meal application for the 2016-17 school year. If benefits are denied or reduced when the NEW application is approved, families will have ten days before the change in eligibility takes effect. Students who have NOT submitted a NEW application will be required to pay full price for school meals starting Monday, October 10, 2016. Additionally, the Oregon Legislature passed a bill allowing school districts to provide lunch free of charge to students who are eligible for reduced price meals.
