SlamBoo!

Did you know there's a poetry program at OG!?

SlamBoo is a performance poetry program for middle school students throughout the Portland area. Each participating school has an elective or after school class that meets to write and share poetry as a team. Ockley Green's core group is led by Mr. Riser and meets most Thursdays from 4:00-5:30. OG students can sign up at any time through SUN School.

Participating schools gather once a month during the SlamBoo season, likely from February through May this year. Two events are hosted at two participating schools, where students are put in small mixed groups with kids from the other schools and given 45 minutes to write and practice a poem to be performed with the other groups. After each group performs, everyone shares a meal together before heading home.

Another event is usually hosted by Marylhurst (a SlamBoo partner organization), with a similar format. Lastly, a final grand slam event is hosted in a large auditorium space (Jefferson HS last year), and is judged by recognized members of the community.

Shakespeare in the Classroom

The Original Practice Shakespeare Festival

(OPSFest) will be visiting some of the Language

Arts classrooms at OG this week! OPSFest is a small performing arts organization dedicated to bringing Shakespeare to a wide variety of audiences. OPSFest introduces Shakespeare to diverse audiences by bringing an immediate freshness to these classic texts, along with significant audience interaction.



This year OPSFest's school program includes an emphasis on social justice. Using the script of "Romeo and Juliet" in combination with techniques from Augusto Boal's Theatre of the Oppressed, the actors will work with students around

the social issues that come up in the play. This three-part workshop will be done with a combination of theatre games, discussion, performance, and students' direct involvement in critical problem solving to rework the dynamics in the play.

School Garden Project

Very exciting update about our school garden! Last fall the Ockley Green school garden received a thorough clean up, and a new tool shed is



being installed. Starting in January, Ockley Green students will be able to engage in their school garden during one lunch hour each week. Thanks to funding

from East Multnomah Soil and Water Conservation District, garden educator Zoe Dawson will be on hand to engage students in garden projects during lunch time. New edible and native plants will be planted in the garden during winter and spring. The garden will also be available to teachers interested in taking their classes into garden.
