Public Comments to PPS Board from a Parent

The letter below is from Jefferson cluster parent Gabrielle Mercedes Bolivar, these are her comments to the PPS Board of Education at their meeting on 12/5/17. Thank you, Ms. Bolivar, for recognizing the efforts that OG staff, teachers, and families are making to become a better school that meets the educational needs of ALL its students!

Good evening Superintendent, PPS Board of Education and Student Rep,

We are a Jefferson Cluster family with three kids attending our neighborhood schools at Chief Joseph, Ockley Green and Jefferson. After years of inequities, we are finally getting glimmers of hope. Middle schools are being restored, efforts to provide culturally responsive inclusive student practices are being pushed, and student success at Jefferson is to be celebrated. Tonight, I want to share the collaborative efforts of key staff working to support our Ockley Green Middle School Community and specifically our students receiving special education services. We know we still have a lot of work to do and this work will be on-going. It is my hope that we can capture meaningful data that is student centered and continue to invest in our middle school students.

This school year Ms. Terri Sing was brought into Ockley Green as the Instructional Support Principal. She has been transforming our Special Education services for our students and working to increase inclusive practices that provide greater access to direct instruction in the general education setting. Last year exclusive practices became the accepted norm with students often pushed out of gen ed, sitting in isolation and or segregated from their gen ed peers. We know from PPS data that our students on IEPs have the lowest graduation rate. Terri Sing together with our 8th grade Special Education teacher Ms. Brenna Sheridan, have been working to identify high risk 8th grade students that are failing at least 2 core subjects. Ms. Sing and Ms. Sheridan created a Saturday School and called to invite each student personally, including my student. For each student identified they worked with each core teacher to create an academic folder for each student and a list of work to be completed to reach grade level. Ms. Sing is scheduling one Saturday School a month through the rest of this school year for identified 8th graders to provide opportunities for individualized direct instruction, to assist students in reaching grade level in core content subjects, and to help prepare students for transition into High School.

It truly takes a village. This year Ockley has a new addition to our custodial Team, Marvin. Marvin has been a critical addition to our community often sitting with our students when they are escalated and need trusted adult support. Marvin is fluently bilingual and came to Saturday School to support our students. He seamlessly worked to support our Spanish speakers in science, math and language arts. This is how you start to create an inclusive and welcoming community where every student belongs and is supported to reach their full academic Potential.

As a community, we asked for culturally relevant multi-tiered systems of support for all students in our middle school as an evidence based best practice model. We know we have work to do, but these glimmers of hope that are student centered and the staff supporting them should be recognized. I appreciate Ms. Sing, Ms. Sheridan and Mr. Marvin for their efforts to center our students, their social-emotional and academic needs. They should be shadowed by other staff as models of effective student centered work.

Lastly, I would like to thank Ms. Brenda Fox and Ms. Kathleen Ellwood from the PPS Middle School Planning committee. Our community had been asking for this past year for a listening session to address the challenges we experienced with our middle school implementation. As part of their assessment, Ms. Fox and Ms. Ellwood held listening sessions during Parent Teacher conferences to capture voices from our staff, parent/caregiver and student communities. Our Site Council has shared our work with them and we are looking forward to a copy of their assessment in hopes that this is the beginning of an open and transparent engagement to collaborate on the success of Ockley Green and all middle schools. We also look forward to the hiring of a permanent principal at Ockley Green soon.
