I was overjoyed earlier this week when I walked into Mr. Signorelli's class and saw all of the students engaged. Each student was on their computer researching African Americans who have made a mark on society. Students will create a written report, an oral report and a poster to decorate the class bulletin board. There is the use of a graphic organizer to help students organize their thoughts and a rubric to allow them to evaluate the quality of their own work.

Did you know that your child can get no cost medical care at the Jefferson Student Health Center? It is open to all K-12 aged youth in Multnomah County. See us for medical care four days a week during the school year. Half of appointments are reserved for same day, so it is easy to get in if your child is sick, injured, or just needs a regular check up. ATTENDANCE IMPROVEMENTS



WHAT THIS MEANS IS THAT WHILE **TEACHERS ARE GREETING STUDENTS AT THE DOOR, ENGAGING STUDENTS** WITH 'DO NOW'S' AND ADDRESSING MULTIPLE ISSUES SIMULTANEOUSLY, THEY ARE ALSO TAKING ATTENDANCE. AND OUR SCHOOL SECRETARY SHAKYLA MONITORS THIS. PLEASE TAKE A MOMENT TO THANK OUR FRONT OFFICE STAFF FOR ALL THE WORK THEY DO IF YOU GET A CHANCE. AS A **RESULT OF THIS FIDELITY, WE HAVE BEEN ABLE TO MONITOR A GROUP OF** STUDENTS THAT ARE REWARDED FOR IMPROVING ATTENDANCE. WITHIN THIS GROUP, APPROXIMATELY 25% HAVE EXITED OUR INTERVENTION EARNING A PIZZA PARTY, MOVIE TICKETS AND 100 ONPOINTS, ANOTHER 25% HAVE MADE SIGNIFICANT IMPROVEMENTS EARNING 25 ONPOINTS AND WE ARE CONTINUING TO MONITOR THE OTHER 50%. **ADDITIONALLY, WE ARE** CHOOSING ANOTHER GROUP TO TARGET FOR THE NEXT 10 WEEK PERIOD. A **BIG SHOUT OUT TO OUR SCHOOL COUNSELOR BRIAN MEYER WHO DEVELOPED** THIS SYSTEM AND SHAKYLA FOR HER INNOVATION AND DILIGENCE IN IMPROVING IT. 
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1. This school year, my child feels safe at Ockley Green Middle School. (Priority 1) 193 responses




2. This school year, my child feels happy at Ockley Green Middle School. (Priority 1) 170 responses







3. This school year, my child feels connected at Ockley Green Middle School to other students. (Priority 1) 170 responses




4. This school year, my child feels connected to Ockley Green Middle School staff. (Priority 1) 170 responses




5. This school year, my child feels supported at Ockley Green Middle School. (Priority 1)



6. This school year, my child feels cared for at Ockley Green Middle School. (Priority 1) 170 responses






